RESOLUTION

Providing for further consideration of the bill (H.R. 4205) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2001 for military activities of the Department of Defense and for military construction, to prescribe military personnel strengths for fiscal year 2001, and for other purposes.

Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this
resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
of the Whole House on the state of the Union for further
consideration of the bill (H.R. 4205) to authorize appro-

priations for fiscal year 2001 for military activities of the
Department of Defense and for military construction, to
prescribe military personnel strengths for fiscal year 2001,
and for other purposes.

5 SEC. 2. (a) No further amendment to the committee 6 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order 7 except those printed in the report of the Committee on 8 Rules accompanying this resolution and pro forma amend-9 ments offered by the chairman or ranking minority mem-10 ber of the Committee on Armed Services for the purpose 11 of debate.

12 (b) Except as specified in section 4 of this resolution, 13 each amendment printed in the report of the Committee on Rules shall be considered only in the order printed in 14 15 the report, may be offered only by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered as read, and shall not 16 be subject to a demand for division of the question in the 17 House or in the Committee of the Whole. Each amend-18 ment printed in the report shall be debatable for the time 19 20 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by 21 the proponent and an opponent and shall not be subject 22 to amendment (except as specified in the report and except 23 that the chairman and ranking minority member of the 24 Committee on Armed Services each may offer one pro

forma amendment for the purpose of further debate on
any pending amendment).

3 (c) All points of order against amendments printed4 in the report of the Committee on Rules are waived.

5 SEC. 3. The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further consider-6 7 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a re-8 corded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five 9 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any 10 postponed question that follows another electronic vote without intervening business, provided that the minimum 11 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-12 13 tions shall be 15 minutes.

14 SEC. 4. The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole 15 may recognize for consideration of any amendment printed 16 in the report of the Committee on Rules out of the order 17 printed, but not sooner than one hour after the chairman 18 of the Committee on Armed Services or a designee an-19 nounces from the floor a request to that effect.

SEC. 5. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be
considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto
to final passage without intervening motion except one
motion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
