- 6 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority
- 7 member of the Committee on Ways and Means; (2) the
- 8 further amendment printed in the report of the Committee
- 9 on Rules accompanying this resolution, which may be of-
- 10 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall
- 11 be considered as read, and shall be separately debatable
- 12 for one hour equally divided and controlled by the pro-
- 13 ponent and an opponent; and (3) one motion to recommit
