Mr. REYNOLDS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution which was referred to the House Calendar and order to be printed

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**RESOLUTION**

Providing for consideration of motions to suspend the rules.

1       *Resolved*, That it shall be in order at any time on  
2 the legislative day of Thursday, October 26, 2000, for the  
3 Speaker to entertain motions that the House suspend the  
4 rules relating to the following measures:

5           (1) the bill (H.R. 2498) to amend the Public  
6 Health Service Act to provide for recommendations  
7 of the Secretary of Health and Human Services re-  
8 garding the placement of automatic external  
9 defibrillators in Federal buildings in order to im-

1 prove survival rates of individuals who experience  
2 cardiac arrest in such buildings, and to establish  
3 protections from civil liability arising from the emer-  
4 gency use of the devices;

5 (2) the resolution (H. Res. 650) expressing the  
6 sense of the House with respect to the release of  
7 findings and recommendations by the Federal En-  
8 ergy Regulatory Commission regarding the elec-  
9 tricity crisis in California;

10 (3) the bill (H.R. 1550) to authorize appropria-  
11 tions for the United States Fire Administration for  
12 fiscal years 2000 and 2001, and for other purposes;

13 (4) the bill (S. 2943) to authorize additional as-  
14 sistance for international malaria control, and to  
15 provide for coordination and consultation in pro-  
16 viding assistance under the Foreign Assistance Act  
17 of 1961 with respect to malaria, HIV, and tuber-  
18 culosis;

19 (5) the bill (S. 2712) to amend chapter 35 of  
20 title 31, United States Code, to authorize the con-  
21 solidation of certain financial and performance man-  
22 agement reports required of Federal agencies, and  
23 for other purposes;

24 (6) the bill (H.R. 5309) to designate the facility  
25 of the United States Postal Service located at 2305

1 Minton Road in West Melbourne, Florida, as the  
2 “Ronald W. Reagan Post Office Building”;

3 (7) the bill (S. 3194) to designate the facility  
4 of the United States Postal Service located at 431  
5 North George Street in Millersville, Pennsylvania, as  
6 the “Robert S. Walker Post Office”;

7 (8) the bill (H.R. 4399) to designate the facility  
8 of the United States Postal Service located at 440  
9 South Orange Blossom Trail in Orlando, Florida, as  
10 the “Arthur ‘Pappy’ Kennedy Post Office Building”;

11 (9) the bill (H.R. 4400) to designate the facility  
12 of the United States Postal Service located at 1601–  
13 1 Main Street in Jacksonville, Florida, as the  
14 “Eddie Mae Steward Post Office Building”;

15 (10) the bill (H.R. 5528) to authorize the con-  
16 struction of a Wakpa Sica Reconciliation Place in  
17 Fort Pierre, South Dakota, and for other purposes;  
18 and

19 (11) the bill (H.R. 5314) to amend title 10,  
20 United States Code, to facilitate the adoption of re-  
21 tired military working dogs by law enforcement  
22 agencies, former handlers of these dogs, and other  
23 persons capable of caring for these dogs.

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
