RESOLUTION

- Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that the future of Taiwan should be resolved peacefully through a democratic mechanism and with the express consent of the people of Taiwan.
- Whereas the principle of self-determination is enshrined in Article 1 of the United Nations Charter;
- Whereas that article encourages development of friendly relations among nations based on the principles of equal rights and self-determination of peoples;

- Whereas the United States and the international community recognize that a right to self-determination exists as a fundamental right of all people, as set forth in numerous United Nations instruments of which the United States is a signatory;
- Whereas the people of Taiwan are committed to the principles of freedom, justice, and democracy;
- Whereas Taiwan has a defined territory, a defined population, and the ability to enter into and keep international agreements;
- Whereas on February 24, 2000, and March 8, 2000, President Clinton stated: "We will . . . continue to make absolutely clear that the issues between Beijing and Taiwan must be resolved peacefully and with the assent of the people of Taiwan."; and
- Whereas both the Republican party and the Democratic party have recently emphasized in their respective platforms that the future of Taiwan should be determined with the consent of its people: Now, therefore, be it
