## AN ACT

For the relief of Wei Jingsheng.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- ${\it 2\ tives\ of\ the\ United\ States\ of\ America\ in\ Congress\ assembled},$

#### SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.

- 2 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
- 3 "Wei Jingsheng Freedom of Conscience Act".
- 4 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for
- 5 purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
- 6 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Wei Jingsheng shall be held and con-
- 7 sidered to have been lawfully admitted to the United
- 8 States for permanent residence as of the date of the enact-
- 9 ment of this Act upon payment of the required visa fee.

### 10 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.

- 11 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Wei
- 12 Jingsheng as provided in this Act, the Secretary of State
- 13 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one during
- 14 the current fiscal year the total number of immigrant visas
- 15 available to natives of the country of the alien's birth
- 16 under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality
- 17 Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)).
