A BILL

For the relief of Wei Jingsheng.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.**

4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
5 “Wei Jingsheng Freedom of Conscience Act”.

6 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for
7 purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Wei Jingsheng shall be held and con-

1 sidered to have been lawfully admitted to the United
2 States for permanent residence as of the date of the enact-
3 ment of this Act upon payment of the required visa fee.

4 **SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.**

5 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Wei
6 Jingsheng as provided in this Act, the Secretary of State
7 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one during
8 the current fiscal year the total number of immigrant visas
9 available to natives of the country of the alien's birth
10 under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality
11 Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)).
