- To conserve global bear populations by prohibiting the importation, exportation, and interstate trade of bear viscera and items, products, or substances containing, or labeled or advertised as containing, bear viscera, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Bear Protection Act5 of 1999".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds that—

8 (1) all 8 extant species of bear—Asian black 9 bear, brown bear, polar bear, American black bear, 10 spectacled bear, giant panda, sun bear, and sloth 11 bear—are listed on Appendix I or II of the Conven-12 tion on International Trade in Endangered Species 13 of Wild Fauna and Flora (27 UST 1087; TIAS 14 8249) (referred to in this section as "CITES");

(2) Article XIV of CITES provides that Parties
to CITES may adopt stricter domestic measures regarding the conditions for trade, taking, possession,
or transport of species on Appendix I or II, and the
Parties to CITES adopted a resolution (Conf. 10.8)
urging Parties to take immediate action to demon-

strably reduce the illegal trade in bear parts and de rivatives;

3 (3) the Asian bear populations have declined 4 significantly in recent years, as a result of habitat 5 loss and poaching due to a strong demand for bear 6 viscera used in traditional medicines and cosmetics; (4) Federal and State undercover operations 7 8 have revealed that American bears have been 9 poached for their viscera; 10 (5) while most American black bear populations 11 are generally stable or increasing, commercial trade 12 could stimulate poaching and threaten certain popu-13 lations if the demand for bear viscera increases; and 14 (6) prohibitions against the importation into 15 the United States and exportation from the United 16 States, as well as prohibitions against the interstate 17 trade, of bear viscera and products containing, or la-18 beled or advertised as containing, bear viscera will 19 assist in ensuring that the United States does not 20 contribute to the decline of any bear population as 21 a result of the commercial trade in bear viscera.

22 SEC. 3. PURPOSES.

23 The purpose of this Act is to ensure the long-term24 viability of the world's 8 bear species by—

1	(1) prohibiting international trade in bear
2	viscera and products containing, or labeled or adver-
3	tised as containing, bear viscera;
4	(2) encouraging bilateral and multilateral ef-
5	forts to eliminate such trade; and
6	(3) ensuring that adequate Federal legislation
7	exists with respect to domestic trade in bear viscera
8	and products containing, or labeled or advertised as
9	containing, bear viscera.
10	SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.
11	In this Act:
12	(1) BEAR VISCERA.—The term "bear viscera"
13	means the body fluids or internal organs, including

19	(6) TRANSPORT.—The term "transport" means
20	to move, convey, carry, or ship by any means, or to
21	deliver or receive for the purpose of movement, con-
22	veyance, carriage, or shipment.
23	SEC. 5. PROHIBITED ACTS.
24	(a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
25	(b), a person shall not—

(1) import into, or export from, the United
 States bear viscera or any product, item, or sub stance containing, or labeled or advertised as con taining, bear viscera; or

5 (2) sell or barter, offer to sell or barter, pur6 chase, possess, transport, deliver, or receive, in inter7 state or foreign commerce, bear viscera or any prod8 uct, item, or substance containing, or labeled or ad9 vertised as containing, bear viscera.

10 (b) EXCEPTION FOR WILDLIFE LAW ENFORCEMENT 11 PURPOSES.—A person described in subparagraph (B) or 12 (C) of section 4(3) may import into, or export from, the 13 United States, or transport between States, bear viscera 14 or any product, item, or substance containing, or labeled 15 or advertised as containing, bear viscera if the importa-16 tion, exportation, or transportation—

17 (1) is solely for wildlife law enforcement pur-18 poses; and

(2) is authorized by a valid permit issued under
Appendix I or II of the Convention on International
Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and
Flora (27 UST 1087; TIAS 8249), in any case in
which such a permit is required under the Convention.

1 SEC. 6. PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT.

2 (a) CRIMINAL PENALTIES.—A person that knowingly
3 violates section 5 shall be fined under title 18, United
4 States Code, imprisoned not more than 1 year, or both.
5 (b) CIVIL PENALTIES.—

6 (1) AMOUNT.—A person that knowingly violates
7 section 5 may be assessed a civil penalty by the Sec8 retary of not more than \$25,000 for each violation.

9 (2) MANNER OF ASSESSMENT AND COLLEC-10 TION.—A civil penalty under this subsection shall be 11 assessed, and may be collected, in the manner in 12 which a civil penalty under the Endangered Species 13 Act of 1973 may be assessed and collected under 14 section 11(a) of that Act (16 U.S.C. 1540(a)).

(c) PRODUCTS, ITEMS, AND SUBSTANCES.—Any bear
viscera, or any product, item, or substance sold, imported,
or exported, or attempted to be sold, imported, or exported, in violation of this section (including any regulation issued under this section) shall be seized and forfeited
to the United States.

(d) REGULATIONS.—After consultation with the Secretary of the Treasury, the Secretary of Health and
Human Services, and the United States Trade Representative, the Secretary shall issue such regulations as are necessary to carry out this section.

1 (e) ENFORCEMENT.—The Secretary, the Secretary of 2 the Treasury, and the Secretary of the department in 3 which the Coast Guard is operating shall enforce this sec-4 tion in the manner in which the Secretaries carry out en-5 forcement activities under section 11(e) of the Endangered 6 Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1540(e)).

7 (f) USE OF PENALTY AMOUNTS.—Amounts received
8 as penalties, fines, or forfeiture of property under this sec9 tion shall be used in accordance with section 6(d) of the
10 Lacey Act Amendments of 1981 (16 U.S.C. 3375(d)).

11 SEC. 7. DISCUSSIONS CONCERNING TRADE PRACTICES.

12 The Secretary and the Secretary of State shall dis-13 cuss issues involving trade in bear viscera with the appropriate representatives of countries trading with the United 14 15 States that are determined by the Secretary and the United States Trade Representative to be the leading im-16 17 porters, exporters, or consumers of bear viscera, and attempt to establish coordinated efforts with the countries 18 19 to protect bears.

20 **SEC. 8. REPORT.**

Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment
of this Act, the Secretary, in cooperation with appropriate
State agencies, shall submit to the Committee on Environment and Public Works of the Senate and the Committee
on Resources of the House of Representatives a report de-

- 1 tailing the progress of efforts to end the illegal trade in
- 2 bear viscera.
