A BILL

To expand the applicability of daylight saving time.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Halloween Safety Act5 of 1999".

6 SEC. 2. DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME EXTENDED TO FIRST WEEK
7 IN NOVEMBER.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 3(a) of the Uniform Time
9 Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. 260a(a)) is amended by striking
10 "last Sunday of October" and inserting in lieu thereof
11 "first Sunday of November".

(b) EFFECT ON EXISTING STATE ELECTIONS.—Any
 law in effect on the date of the enactment of this Act
 which is—

4 (1) adopted pursuant to section 3(a)(2) of the
5 Uniform Time Act of 1966 by a State with parts
6 thereof in more than one time zone, or

7 (2) adopted pursuant to section 3(a)(1) of such
8 Act by a State that lies entirely within one time
9 zone,

10 shall be held and considered to remain in effect as the11 exercise by that State of the exemption permitted by such12 Act unless that State, by law, provides that such exemp-13 tion shall not apply.

14 (c) ADJUSTMENT OF OPERATING HOURS OF DAY-15 TIME BROADCASTERS.—Notwithstanding any other law or any regulation issued under any such law, the Federal 16 17 Communications Commission shall, consistent with any existing treaty or other agreement, make such adjustment 18 19 by general rules, or by interim action pending such general 20 rules, with respect to hours of operation of daytime stand-21 ard amplitude modulation broadcast stations, as may be 22 consistent with the public interest in receiving inter-23 ference-free service.

(1) Such general rules, or interim action, may
 include variances with respect to operating power
 and other technical operating characteristics.

4 (2) At any time subsequent to the adoption of
5 such general rules, such general rules may be varied
6 with respect to particular stations and areas because
7 of the exigencies in each case.

8 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This Act shall take effect9 upon enactment.
