9	"(I) is not a paid advertisement;
10	"(II) does not solicit funds for, or on be-
11	half of, a candidate or political committee;
12	"(III) is disseminated for the purpose of
13	communicating or disseminating the opinion of
14	such individual (including an endorsement) re-
15	garding a political issue or candidate; and
16	"(IV) is not communicated or disseminated
17	by any individual that receives payment or any
