3 SECTION 1. DEATH ON THE HIGH SEAS ACT.

4 Section 40120(c) of title 49, United States Code, is5 amended to read as follows:

6 "(c) Additional Remedies.—

- 7 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Nothing in this part or the
- 8 Act entitled 'An Act relating to the maintenance of

9	"(2) Additional remedies.—Any remedy
10	provided for under this part or the Act referred to
11	in paragraph (1) for an injury or death arising out
12	of any covered aviation incident shall be in addition
13	to any of the remedies described in subparagraphs
14	(A) and (B) of paragraph (1).
15	"(3) Covered aviation incident defined.—
16	In this subsection, the term 'covered aviation inci-
17	dent' means an aviation disaster occurring on or
18	after January 1, 1995.".

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
