## AN ACT

To permit the conveyance of certain land in Powell, Wyoming.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### SECTION 1. ELIMINATION OF PUBLIC PURPOSE CONDI-2 TION. 3 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that— 4 (1) the parcel of land described in subsection 5 (c) was patented to the town (now City) of Powell, 6 Wyoming, by the United States General Land Office 7 on October 17, 1934, to help establish a town near 8 the Shoshone Irrigation Project; 9 (2) the land was patented with the condition 10 that it be used forever for a public purpose, as re-11 quired by section 3 of the Act of April 16, 1906 (43) 12 U.S.C. 566); 13 (3) the land has been used to house the Powell 14 Volunteer Fire Department, which serves the fire-15 fighting and rescue needs of a 577 square mile area 16 in northwestern Wyoming; 17 (4) the land is located at the corner of U.S. 18 Highway 14 and the main street of the business dis-19 trict of the City; 20 (5) because of the high traffic flow in the area, 21 the location is no longer safe for the public or for 22 the fire department; 23 (6) in response to population growth in the area 24 and to National Fire Protection Association regula-

tions, the fire department has purchased new fire-

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- fighting equipment that is much larger than the existing fire hall can accommodate;
  - (7) accordingly, the fire department must construct a new fire department facility at a new and safe location;
    - (8) in order to relocate and construct a new facility, the City must sell the land to assist in financing the new fire department facility; and
    - (9) the Secretary of the Interior concurs that it is in the public interest to eliminate the public purpose condition to enable the land to be sold for that purpose.

#### (b) Elimination of Condition.—

- (1) WAIVER.—The condition stated in section 3 of the Act of April 16, 1906 (43 U.S.C. 566), that land conveyed under that Act be used forever for a public purpose is waived insofar as the condition applies to the land described in subsection (c).
- 19 (2) Instruments.—The Secretary of the Inte-20 rior shall execute and cause to be recorded in the 21 appropriate land records any instruments necessary 22 to evidence the waiver made by paragraph (1).
- 23 (c) Land Description.—The parcel of land de-24 scribed in this subsection is a parcel of land located in

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- 1 Powell, Park County, Wyoming, the legal description of
- 2 which is as follows:
- 3 Lot 23, Block 54, in the original town of Pow-
- 4 ell, according to the plat recorded in Book 82 of
- 5 plats, Page 252, according to the records of the
- 6 County Clerk and Recorder of Park County, State of
- 7 Wyoming.
