To provide trade adjustment assistance for certain workers.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. TRADE ADJUSTMENT ASSISTANCE. 4 (a) CERTIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY FOR WORKERS 5 REQUIRED FOR CLOSURE OF FACILITY.— 6 (1) In General.—Notwithstanding any other 7 provision of law or any decision by the Secretary of 8 Labor denying certification or eligibility for certifi-9 cation for adjustment assistance under title II of the

Trade Act of 1974, a qualified worker described in

paragraph (2) shall be certified by the Secretary as

1	eligible to apply for adjustment assistance under
2	such title II.
3	(2) Qualified worker.—For purposes of this
4	subsection, a "qualified worker" means a worker
5	who—
6	(A) was determined to be covered under
7	Trade Adjustment Assistance Certification TA-
8	W-31,402; and
9	(B) was necessary for the environmental
10	remediation or closure of a copper mining facil-
11	ity.
12	(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
13	this section shall take effect on the date of enactment of
14	this Act.
