## AN ACT

To amend the Public Health Service Act to revise the performance standards and certification process for organ procurement organizations.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## SECTION 1. ORGAN PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATION CER-2 TIFICATION ACT OF 2000. 3 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-4 ings: 5 (1) Organ procurement organizations play an 6 important role in the effort to increase organ dona-7 tion in the United States. 8 (2) The current process for the certification and 9 recertification of organ procurement organizations conducted by the Department of Health and Human 10 11 Services has created a level of uncertainty that is 12 interfering with the effectiveness of organ procure-13 ment organizations in raising the level of organ do-14 nation. 15 (3) The General Accounting Office, the Institute of Medicine, and the Harvard School of Public 16 17 Health have identified substantial limitations in the 18 organ procurement organization certification and re-19 certification process and have recommended changes 20 in that process. 21 (4) The limitations in the recertification process 22 include: 23 (A) An exclusive reliance on population-24 based measures of performance that do not ac-25 count for the potential in the population for

organ donation and do not permit consideration

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- of other outcome and process standards that
  would more accurately reflect the relative capability and performance of each organ procurement organization.
  - (B) A lack of due process to appeal to the Secretary of Health and Human Services for recertification on either substantive or procedural grounds.
  - (5) The Secretary of Health and Human Services has the authority under section 1138(b)(1)(A)(i) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1320b–8(b)(1)(A)(i)) to extend the period for recertification of an organ procurement organization from 2 to 4 years on the basis of its past practices in order to avoid the inappropriate disruption of the nation's organ system.
  - (6) The Secretary of Health and Human Services can use the extended period described in paragraph (5) for recertification of all organ procurement organizations to—
    - (A) develop improved performance measures that would reflect organ donor potential and interim outcomes, and to test these measures to ensure that they accurately measure

3	(B) improve the overall certification proc-
4	ess by incorporating process as well as outcome
5	performance measures, and developing equitable
6	processes for appeals.
7	(b) CERTIFICATION AND RECERTIFICATION OF
8	ORGAN PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATIONS.—Section
9	371(b)(1) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
10	273(b)(1)) is amended—
11	(1) by redesignating subparagraphs (D)
12	through (G) as subparagraphs (E) through (H), re-
13	spectively;
14	(2) by realigning the margin of subparagraph
15	(F) (as so redesignated) so as to align with subpara-
16	graph (E) (as so redesignated); and
17	(3) by inserting after subparagraph (C) the fol-
18	lowing:
19	"(D) notwithstanding any other provision of
20	law, has met the other requirements of this section
21	and has been certified or recertified by the Secretary
22	within the previous 4-year period as meeting the
23	performance standards to be a qualified organ pro-
24	curement organization through a process that
25	either—

1	"(i) granted certification or recertification
2	within such 4-year period with such certification
3	or recertification in effect as of January 1,
4	2000, and remaining in effect through the ear-
5	lier of—
6	"(I) January 1, 2002; or
7	"(II) the completion of recertification
8	under the requirements of clause (ii); or
9	"(ii) is defined through regulations that
10	are promulgated by the Secretary by not later
11	than January 1, 2002, that—
12	"(I) require recertifications of quali-
13	fied organ procurement organizations not
14	more frequently than once every 4 years;
15	"(II) rely on outcome and process per-
16	formance measures that are based on em-
17	pirical evidence, obtained through reason-
18	able efforts, of organ donor potential and
19	other related factors in each service area of
20	qualified organ procurement organizations;
21	"(III) use multiple outcome measures
22	as part of the certification process; and
23	"(IV) provide for a qualified organ
24	procurement organization to appeal a de-

certification to the Secretary on substantive and procedural grounds;".
