A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to enter into contracts with the city of Loveland, Colorado, to use Colorado-Big Thompson Project facilities for the impounding, storage, and carriage of nonproject water for domestic, municipal, industrial, and other beneficial purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. USE OF COLORADO-BIG THOMPSON PROJECT**
4 **FACILITIES FOR NONPROJECT WATER.**

5 The Secretary of the Interior may enter into con-
6 tracts with the city of Loveland, Colorado, or its Water

1 and Power Department or any other agency, public utility,
2 or enterprise of the city, providing for the use of facilities
3 of the Colorado-Big Thompson Project, Colorado, under
4 the Act of February 21, 1911 (43 U.S.C. 523), for—

5 (1) the impounding, storage, and carriage of
6 nonproject water originating on the eastern slope of
7 the Rocky Mountains for domestic, municipal, indus-
8 trial, and other beneficial purposes; and

9 (2) the exchange of water originating on the
10 eastern slope of the Rocky Mountains for the pur-
11 poses specified in paragraph (1), using facilities as-
12 sociated with the Colorado-Big Thompson Project,
13 Colorado.
