Mr. Cleland (for himself, Mr. Kerry, Mr. Hollings, Mr. Conrad, Mrs. Boxer, Mr. Daschle, and Mr. Harkin) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Small Business

## A BILL

To authorize the establishment of a disaster mitigation pilot program in the Small Business Administration.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. DISASTER MITIGATION PILOT PROGRAM.
4	(a) In General.—Section 7(b)(1) of the Small Busi-
5	ness Act (15 U.S.C. 636(b)(1)) is amended—
6	(1) in subparagraph (B), by adding "and" at
7	the end; and
8	(2) by adding at the end the following:
9	"(C) during fiscal years 2000 through 2004, to

establish a predisaster mitigation program to make

- 1 such loans (either directly or in cooperation with
- 2 banks or other lending institutions through agree-
- 3 ments to participate on an immediate or deferred
- 4 (guaranteed) basis), as the Administrator may deter-
- 5 mine to be necessary or appropriate, to enable small
- 6 businesses to use mitigation techniques in support of
- 7 a formal mitigation program established by the Fed-
- 8 eral Emergency Management Agency, except that no
- 9 loan or guarantee may be extended to a small busi-
- 10 ness under this subparagraph unless the Administra-
- tion finds that the small business is otherwise unable
- to obtain credit for the purposes described in this
- subparagraph;".
- 14 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—Section
- 15 20 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 631 note) is
- 16 amended by adding at the end the following:
- 17 "(f) Disaster Mitigation Pilot Program.—The
- 18 following program levels are authorized for loans under
- 19 section 7(b)(1)(C):
- (1) \$15,000,000 for fiscal year 2000.
- 21 "(2) \$15,000,000 for fiscal year 2001.
- 22 "(3) \$15,000,000 for fiscal year 2002.
- 23 "(4) \$15,000,000 for fiscal year 2003.
- "(5) \$15,000,000 for fiscal year 2004.".

1	(c) EVALUATION.—On January 31, 2003, the Admin-
2	istrator of the Small Business Administration shall submit
3	to the Committees on Small Business of the House of Rep-
4	resentatives and the Senate a report on the effectiveness
5	of the pilot program authorized by section 7(b)(1)(C) of
6	the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 636(b)(1)(C)), as
7	added by subsection (a) of this section, which report shall
8	include—
9	(1) information relating to—
10	(A) the areas served under the pilot pro-
11	gram;
12	(B) the number and dollar value of loans
13	made under the pilot program; and
14	(C) the estimated savings to the Federal
15	Government resulting from the pilot program;
16	and
17	(2) such other information as the Administrator
18	determines to be appropriate for evaluating the pilot
19	program.
