AN ACT

For the relief of Belinda McGregor.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.

- 2 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for
- 3 purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8)
- 4 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Belinda McGregor shall be held and
- 5 considered to have been selected for a diversity immigrant
- 6 visa for fiscal year 2000 as of the date of the enactment
- 7 of this Act upon payment of the required visa fee.
- 8 (b) Adjustment of Status.—If Belinda McGregor,
- 9 or any child (as defined in section 101(b)(1) of the Immi-
- 10 gration and Nationality Act) of Belinda McGregor, enters
- 11 the United States before the date of the enactment of this
- 12 Act, he or she shall be considered to have entered and
- 13 remained lawfully and shall, if otherwise eligible, be eligi-
- 14 ble for adjustment of status under section 245 of the Im-
- 15 migration and Nationality Act as of the date of the enact-
- 16 ment of this Act.

17 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.

- 18 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Belinda
- 19 McGregor as provided in this Act, the Secretary of State
- 20 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one number
- 21 during the current fiscal year the total number of immi-
- 22 grant visas available to natives of the country of the alien's

- 1 birth under section 203(c) of the Immigration and Nation-
- 2 ality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(c)).
