AN ACT

To establish the Fallen Timbers Battlefield and Fort Miamis National Historical Site in the State of Ohio.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fallen Timbers Battle-
- 5 field and Fort Miamis National Historic Site Act of
- 6 1999".

1 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS. 2 As used in this Act: 3 (a) Definitions.— (1) The term "historic site" means the Fallen 4 5 Timbers Battlefield and Monument and Fort Miamis 6 National Historic Site established by section 4 of 7 this Act. (2) The term "management plan" means the 8 9 general management plan developed pursuant to section 5(d). 10 (3) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary 11 12 of the Interior. (4) The term "management entity" means the 13 14 Metropolitan Park District of the Toledo Area. 15 (5) The term "technical assistance" means any 16 guidance, advice, or other aid, other than financial 17 assistance, provided by the Secretary. 18 SEC. 3. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES. 19 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following: 20 (1) The 185-acre Fallen Timbers Battlefield is 21 the site of the 1794 battle between General Anthony 22 Wayne and a confederation of Native American 23 tribes led by Little Turtle and Blue Jacket.

24 (2) Fort Miamis was occupied by General 25 Wayne's legion from 1796 to 1798.

1	(3) In the spring of 1813, British troops, led by
2	General Henry Proctor, landed at Fort Miamis and
3	attacked the fort twice, without success.
4	(4) Fort Miamis and Fallen Timbers Battlefield
5	are in Lucas County, Ohio, in the city of Maumee.
6	(5) The 9-acre Fallen Timbers Battlefield
7	Monument is listed as a National Historic Land-
8	mark.
9	(6) Fort Miamis is listed in the National Reg-
10	ister of Historic Places as a historic site.
11	(7) In 1959, the Fallen Timbers Battlefield was
12	included in the National Survey of Historic Sites
13	and Buildings as 1 of 22 sites representing the "Ad-
14	vance of the Frontier, 1763–1830".
15	(8) In 1960, the Fallen Timbers Battlefield was
16	designated as a National Historic Landmark.
17	(b) Purposes.—The purposes of this Act are—
18	(1) to recognize and preserve the 185-acre Fall-
19	en Timbers Battlefield site;
20	(2) to recognize and preserve the Fort Miamis
21	site;
22	(3) to formalize the linkage of the Fallen Tim-
23	bers Battlefield and Monument to Fort Miamis;

- 1 (4) to preserve and interpret United States 2 military history and Native American culture during 3 the period from 1794 through 1813;
 - (5) to provide assistance to the State of Ohio, political subdivisions of the State, and nonprofit organizations in the State to implement the management plan and develop programs that will preserve and interpret the historical, cultural, natural, recreational and scenic resources of the historic site; and
 - (6) to authorize the Secretary to provide technical assistance to the State of Ohio, political subdivisions of the State, and nonprofit organizations in the State, including the Ohio Historical Society, the city of Maumee, the Maumee Valley Heritage Corridor, the Fallen Timbers Battlefield Commission, Heidelberg College, the city of Toledo, and the Metropark District of the Toledo Area, to implement the management plan.
- 20 SEC. 4. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FALLEN TIMBERS BAT-
- 21 TLEFIELD AND FORT MIAMIS NATIONAL HIS-
- TORIC SITE.
- 23 (a) In General.—There is established, as an affili-
- 24 ated area of the National Park System, the Fallen Tim-

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- 1 bers Battlefield and Fort Miamis National Historic Site
- 2 in the State of Ohio.
- 3 (b) Description.—The historic site is comprised of
- 4 the following as generally depicted on the map entitled
- 5 Fallen Timbers Battlefield and Fort Miamis National His-
- 6 torical Site-proposed, number NHS-FTFM, and dated
- 7 May 1999:
- 8 (1) The Fallen Timbers site, comprised gen-
- 9 erally of the following:
- 10 (A) The Fallen Timbers Battlefield site,
- 11 consisting of an approximately 185-acre parcel
- located north of U.S. 24, west of U.S. 23/I-
- 13 475, south of the Norfolk and Western Railroad
- line, and east of Jerome Road.
- 15 (B) The approximately 9-acre Fallen Tim-
- bers Battlefield Monument, located south of
- 17 U.S. 24; and
- 18 (2) The Fort Miamis Park site.
- (c) MAP.—The map shall be on file and avail-
- able for public inspection in the appropriate offices
- of the National Park Service.
- 22 SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION OF HISTORIC SITES.
- 23 (a) Applicability of National Park System
- 24 Laws.—The historic site shall be administered in a man-
- 25 ner consistent with this Act and all laws generally applica-

- 1 ble to units of the National Park System, including the
- 2 Act of August 25, 1916 (16 U.S.C. 1, 2–4; commonly
- 3 known as the National Park Service Organic Act), and
- 4 the Act of August 21, 1935 (16 U.S.C. 461 et seq.; com-
- 5 monly known as the Historic Sites, Buildings, and Antiq-
- 6 uities Act).
- 7 (b) Cooperative Agreement.—The Secretary may
- 8 enter into a cooperative agreement with the management
- 9 entity to provide technical assistance to ensure the mark-
- 10 ing, research, interpretation, education and preservation
- 11 of the Fallen Timbers Battlefield and Fort Miamis Na-
- 12 tional Historic Site.
- 13 (c) Reimbursement.—Any payment made by the
- 14 Secretary pursuant to this section shall be subject to an
- 15 agreement that conversion, use, or disposal of the project
- 16 so assisted for purposes contrary to the purposes of this
- 17 section as determined by the Secretary, shall result in a
- 18 right of the United States to reimbursement of all funds
- 19 made available to such project or the proportion of the
- 20 increased value of the project attributable to such funds
- 21 as determined at the time of such conversion, use, or dis-
- 22 posal, whichever is greater.
- 23 (d) General Management Plan.—
- 24 (1) In General.—The Secretary, in consulta-
- 25 tion with the management entity and Native Amer-

1	ican tribes whose ancestors were involved in events
2	at these sites, shall develop a general management
3	plan for the historic site. The plan shall be prepared
4	in accordance with section 12(b) of Public Law 91-
5	383 (16 U.S.C. 1a-1 et seq.; commonly known as
6	the National Park System General Authorities Act).
7	(2) Completed.—The plan shall be completed
8	not later than 2 years after the date funds are made
9	available.
10	(3) Transmittal.—Not later than 30 days
11	after completion of the plan, the Secretary shall pro-
12	vide a copy of the plan to the Committee on Energy
13	and Natural Resources of the Senate and the Com-
14	mittee on Resources of the House of Representa-
15	tives.
16	SEC. 6. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS
17	There is authorized to be appropriated such funds as
18	are necessary to carry out this Act.
