## **AN ACT**

- To provide adversely affected crop producers with additional time to make fully informed risk management decisions for the 1999 crop year.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## SECTION 1. CROP INSURANCE OPTIONS FOR PRODUCERS WHO APPLIED FOR CROP REVENUE COV ERAGE PLUS.

4 (a) ELIGIBLE PRODUCERS.—This section applies 5 with respect to a producer eligible for insurance under the 6 Federal Crop Insurance Act (7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.) who 7 applied for the supplemental crop insurance endorsement 8 known as Crop Revenue Coverage PLUS (referred to in 9 this section as "CRCPLUS") for the 1999 crop year for 10 a spring planted agricultural commodity.

11 (b) Additional Period for Obtaining or Trans-FERRING COVERAGE.—Notwithstanding the sales closing 12 13 date for obtaining crop insurance coverage established under section 508(f)(2) of the Federal Crop Insurance Act 14 (7 U.S.C. 1508(f)(2)) and notwithstanding any other pro-15 16 vision of law, the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation shall provide a 14-day period beginning on the date of en-17 18 actment of this Act, but not to extend beyond April 12, 19 1999, during which a producer described in subsection (a) 20 may—

(1) with respect to a federally reinsured policy,
obtain from any approved insurance provider a level
of coverage for the agricultural commodity for which
the producer applied for the CRCPLUS endorsement that is equivalent to or less than the level of
federally reinsured coverage that the producer ap-

1	plied for from the insurance provider that offered
2	the CRCPLUS endorsement; and
3	(2) transfer to any approved insurance provider
4	any federally reinsured coverage provided for other
5	agricultural commodities of the producer by the
6	same insurance provider that offered the CRCPLUS
7	endorsement, as determined by the Corporation.
