AN ACT

- To require the Department of Agriculture to establish an electronic filing and retrieval system to enable the public to file all required paperwork electronically with the Department and to have access to public information on farm programs, quarterly trade, economic, and production reports, and other similar information.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Freedom to E-File
- 5 Act".

1 SEC. 2. ELECTRONIC FILING AND RETRIEVAL.

2	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
3	date of enactment of this Act, in accordance with sub-
4	section (c), the Secretary of Agriculture (referred to in
5	this Act as the "Secretary") shall, to the maximum extent
6	practicable, establish an Internet-based system that en-
7	ables agricultural producers to access all forms of the
8	agencies of the Department of Agriculture specified in
9	subsection (b).
10	(b) Applicability.—The agencies referred to in
11	subsection (a) are—
12	(1) the Farm Service Agency;
13	(2) the Rural Utilities Service;
14	(3) the Rural Housing Service;
15	(4) the Rural Business-Cooperative Service; and
16	(5) the Natural Resources Conservation Service.
17	(c) Implementation.—In carrying out subsection
18	(a), the Secretary shall—
19	(1) provide a method by which agricultural pro-
20	ducers may—
21	(A) download forms from the Internet; and
22	(B) submit completed forms via electronic
23	facsimile, mail, or similar means;
24	(2) redesign forms of the agencies of the De-
25	partment of Agriculture by incorporating into the

- 3 (d) Progress Reports.—Not later than 180 days
- 4 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall
- 5 submit to Congress a report that describes the progress

- 8 SEC. 3. ACCESSING INFORMATION AND FILING OVER THE
- 9 **INTERNET.**
- 10 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after the
- 11 date of enactment of this Act, in accordance with sub-
- 12 section (b), the Secretary shall expand implementation of
- 13 the Internet-based system established under section 2 by
- 14 enabling agricultural producers to access and file all forms
- 15 and, at the option of the Secretary, selected records and
- 16 information of the agencies of the Department specified
- 17 in section 2(b).
- 18 (b) Implementation.—In carrying out subsection
- 19 (a), the Secretary shall ensure that an agricultural pro-
- 20 ducer is able—
- 21 (1) to file electronically or in paper form, at the
- option of the agricultural producer, all forms re-
- 23 quired by agencies of the Department specified in
- section 2(b);

16	(c) Implementation.—Not later than December 1,

20	SEC. 5. CONFIDENTIALITY.
21	In carrying out this Act, the Secretary—
22	(1) may not make available any information
23	over the Internet that would otherwise not be avail-
24	able for release under section 552 or 552a of title
25	5, United States Code; and

- 1 (2) shall ensure, to the maximum extent prac-
- 2 ticable, that the confidentiality of persons is main-
- 3 tained.
