Mr. MCCONNELL (for himself, Mr. BENNETT, Mr. CONRAD, and Mr. DOR-GAN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

To provide for the protection of the flag of the United States, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Flag Protection Act

5 of 1999".

#### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

8 (1) the flag of the United States is a unique
9 symbol of national unity and represents the values
10 of liberty, justice, and equality that make this Na-

tion an example of freedom unmatched throughout
 the world;

3 (2) the Bill of Rights is a guarantee of those
4 freedoms and should not be amended in a manner
5 that could be interpreted to restrict freedom, a
6 course that is regularly resorted to by authoritarian
7 governments which fear freedom and not by free and
8 democratic nations;

9 (3) abuse of the flag of the United States 10 causes more than pain and distress to the over-11 whelming majority of the American people and may 12 amount to fighting words or a direct threat to the 13 physical and emotional well-being of individuals at 14 whom the threat is targeted; and

(4) destruction of the flag of the United States
(a) destruction of the flag of the United States
(b) can be intended to incite a violent response rather
than make a political statement and such conduct is
outside the protections afforded by the first amendment to the Constitution.

(b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to provide
the maximum protection against the use of the flag of the
United States to promote violence while respecting the liberties that it symbolizes.

# 1SEC. 3. PROTECTION OF THE FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES2AGAINST USE FOR PROMOTING VIOLENCE.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 700 of title 18, United4 States Code, is amended to read as follows:

## 5 "§ 700. Incitement; damage or destruction of property

involving the flag of the United States

7 "(a) DEFINITION OF FLAG OF THE UNITED 8 STATES.—In this section, the term 'flag of the United 9 States' means any flag of the United States, or any part 10 thereof, made of any substance, in any size, in a form that 11 is commonly displayed as a flag and that would be taken 12 to be a flag by the reasonable observer.

13 "(b) ACTIONS PROMOTING VIOLENCE.—Any person who destroys or damages a flag of the United States with 14 the primary purpose and intent to incite or produce immi-15 nent violence or a breach of the peace, and under cir-16 17 cumstances in which the person knows that it is reason-18 ably likely to produce imminent violence or a breach of 19 the peace, shall be fined not more than \$100,000, impris-20oned not more than 1 year, or both.

21 "(c) DAMAGING A FLAG BELONGING TO THE UNITED
22 STATES.—Any person who steals or knowingly converts to
23 his or her use, or to the use of another, a flag of the
24 United States belonging to the United States, and who
25 intentionally destroys or damages that flag, shall be fined

not more than \$250,000, imprisoned not more than 2
 years, or both.

3 "(d) DAMAGING A FLAG OF ANOTHER ON FEDERAL 4 LAND.—Any person who, within any lands reserved for the use of the United States, or under the exclusive or 5 concurrent jurisdiction of the United States, steals or 6 7 knowingly converts to his or her use, or to the use of an-8 other, a flag of the United States belonging to another 9 person, and who intentionally destroys or damages that 10 flag, shall be fined not more than \$250,000, imprisoned not more than 2 years, or both. 11

12 "(e) CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this section shall 13 be construed to indicate an intent on the part of Congress 14 to deprive any State, territory, or possession of the United 15 States, or the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico of jurisdic-16 tion over any offense over which it would have jurisdiction 17 in the absence of this section.".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The analysis for chapter 33 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by
striking the item relating to section 700 and inserting the
following:
