CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for a conditional adjournment or recess of the Senate and a conditional adjournment of the House of Representatives.

1 Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives 2 concurring), That, in consonance with section 132(a) of 3 the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, when the Sen-4 ate recesses or adjourns at the close of business on Thurs-5 day, July 27, 2000, Friday, July 28, 2000, or on Saturday, July 29, 2000, on a motion offered pursuant to this 6 7 concurrent resolution by its Majority Leader or his des-8 ignee, it stand recessed or adjourned until noon on Tues-9 day, September 5, 2000, or until noon on Wednesday, September 6, 2000, or until such time on either day as 10

may be specified by its Majority Leader or his designee 1 in the motion to recess or adjourn, or until noon on the 2 3 second day after Members are notified to reassemble pur-4 suant to section 2 of this concurrent resolution, whichever 5 occurs first; and that when the House adjourns on the legislative day of Thursday, July 27, 2000, or Friday, July 6 7 28, 2000, on a motion offered pursuant to this concurrent 8 resolution by its Majority Leader or his designee, it stand 9 adjourned until 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 6, 10 2000, or until noon on the second day after Members are notified to reassemble pursuant to section 2 of this concur-11 12 rent resolution, whichever occurs first.

13 SEC. 2. The Majority Leader of the Senate and the 14 Speaker of the House, acting jointly after consultation 15 with the Minority Leader of the Senate and the Minority 16 Leader of the House, shall notify the Members of the Sen-17 ate and House, respectively, to reassemble whenever, in 18 their opinion, the public interest shall warrant it.
