CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol grounds for the dedication of the Japanese-American Memorial to Patriotism.

1 Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives
2 concurring),
3 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.
4 In this Resolution:
5 (1) EVENT.—The term "event" means the dedi6 cation of the National Japanese-American Memorial
7 to Patriotism .
8 (2) SPONSOR.—The term "sponsor" means the

National Japanese-American Memorial Foundation.

1	SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF EVENT TO CELEBRATE THE
2	DEDICATION OF THE NATIONAL JAPANESE-
3	AMERICAN MEMORIAL.
4	The National Japanese-American Memorial Founda-
5	tion may sponsor the dedication of the National Japanese-
6	American Memorial to Patriotism on the Capitol grounds
7	on November 9, 2000, or on such other date as the Speak-
8	er of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
9	Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly des-
10	ignate.
11	SEC. 3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.
12	(a) IN GENERAL.—The event shall be open to the
13	public, free of admission charge, and arranged so as not
14	to interfere with the needs of Congress, under conditions
15	to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the
16	Capitol Police Board.
17	(b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
18	assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
19	incident to all activities associated with the event.
20	SEC. 4. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.
21	(a) Structures and Equipment.—
22	(1) In general.—Subject to the approval of
23	the Architect of the Capitol, beginning on November
24	8, 2000, the sponsor may erect or place and keep on
25	the Capitol grounds, until not later than 8:00 p.m.
26	on Saturday, November 11, 2000, such stage, sound

- 1 amplification devices, and other related structures
- 2 and equipment as are required for the event.
- 3 (b) Additional Arrangements.—The Architect of
- 4 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board may make any
- 5 such additional arrangements as are appropriate to carry
- 6 out the event.

7 SEC. 5. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.

- 8 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
- 9 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
- 10 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
- 11 cerning sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations
- 12 on the Capitol grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
- 13 cable to the Capitol grounds, with respect to the event.
