1 SEC. 3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

- 2 (a) In General.—The event shall be open to the
- 3 public, free of admission charge, and arranged so as not
- 4 to interfere with the needs of Congress, under conditions
- 5 to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the
- 6 Capitol Police Board.
- 7 (b) Expenses and Liabilities.—The sponsor shall
- 8 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
- 9 incident to all activities associated with the event.

10 SEC. 4. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.

- 11 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—
