Mr. McCONNELL submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was considered and agreed to

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To authorize the printing of copies of the publication entitled “The United States Capitol” as a Senate document.

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring)*, That (a) a revised edition of the publication
3 entitled “The United States Capitol” (referred to as “the
4 pamphlet”) shall be reprinted as a Senate document.

5 (b) There shall be printed a total of 2,850,000 copies
6 of the pamphlet in English and seven other languages at
7 a cost not to exceed \$165,900 for distribution as follows:

8 (1)(A) 206,000 copies of the pamphlet in the
9 English language for the use of the Senate with
10 2,000 copies distributed to each Member;

1 (B) 886,000 copies of the pamphlet in the
2 English language for the use of the House of Rep-
3 resentatives with 2,000 copies distributed to each
4 Member; and

5 (C) 1,758,000 copies of the pamphlet for dis-
6 tribution to the Capitol Guide Service in the fol-
7 lowing languages:

8 (i) 908,000 copies in English;

9 (ii) 100,000 copies in each of the following
10 seven languages: Spanish, German, French,
11 Russian, Japanese, Italian, and Korean; and

12 (iii) 150,000 copies in Chinese.

13 (2) If the total printing and production costs of
14 copies in paragraph (1) exceed \$165,900, such num-
15 ber of copies of the pamphlet as does not exceed
16 total printing and production costs of \$165,900,
17 shall be printed with distribution to be allocated in
18 the same proportion as in paragraph (1) as it relates
19 to numbers of copies in the English language.
