## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To provide for the disposition and archiving of the records, files, documents, and other materials of joint congressional committees on inaugural ceremonies.

1       *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*  
2   *concurring),*

3   **SECTION 1. RECORDS OF EACH JOINT CONGRESSIONAL**  
4                   **COMMITTEE ON INAUGURAL CEREMONIES.**

5        (a) IN GENERAL.—Upon the conclusion of the busi-  
6   ness of a joint congressional committee on Presidential in-  
7   augural ceremonies and the closing out of its affairs, all  
8   records, files, documents, and other materials in the pos-

1 session, custody, or control of the joint committee shall  
2 be transferred subject to—

3 (1) such terms and conditions relating to access  
4 and use of such materials as the Committee on  
5 Rules and Administration of the Senate shall pre-  
6 scribe; and

7 (2) the provisions of Senate Resolution 474  
8 (96th Congress, 2d Session).

9 (b) PRIOR RECORDS.—The records, files, documents,  
10 and other materials of any joint congressional committee  
11 on Presidential inaugural ceremonies in the custody of the  
12 Senate on the date of adoption of this resolution shall be  
13 transferred subject to—

14 (1) such terms and conditions relating to access  
15 and use of such materials as the Committee on  
16 Rules and Administration of the Senate shall pre-  
17 scribe; and

18 (2) the provisions of Senate Resolution 474  
19 (96th Congress, 2d Session).
