Authorizing expenditures by the Special Committee on Aging.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. GRASSLEY, from the Special Committee on Aging, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Special Committee on Aging.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Special Committee on Aging is authorized from Octo-
8 ber 1, 1999, through September 30, 2000, and October
9 1, 2000, through February 28, 2001, in its discretion—
10 (1) to make expenditures from the contingent
11 fund of the Senate,

1 (2) to employ personnel, and

2 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
3 department or agency concerned and the Committee
4 on Rules and Administration, to use on a reimburs-
5 able or nonreimbursable basis the services of per-
6 sonnel of any such department or agency.

7 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
8 period October 1, 1999, through September 30, 2000,
9 under this resolution shall not exceed \$1,459,827, of
10 which amount not to exceed \$50,000 may be expended for
11 the procurement of the services of individual consultants
12 or organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i)
13 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amend-
14 ed).

15 (b) For the period October 1, 2000, through Feb-
16 ruary 28, 2001, expenses of the committee under this res-
17 olution shall not exceed \$622,709, of which amount not
18 to exceed \$50,000 may be expended for the procurement
19 of the services of individual consultants or organizations
20 thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative
21 Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended).

22 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
23 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
24 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable

1 date, but not later than February 29, 2000, and February
2 28, 2001, respectively.

3 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
4 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
5 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the com-
6 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required—

7 (1) for the disbursement of salaries of employ-
8 ees paid at an annual rate,

9 (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
10 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and
11 Doorkeeper, United States Senate,

12 (3) for the payment of stationery supplies pur-
13 chased through the Keeper of the Stationery, United
14 States Senate,

15 (4) for payments to the Postmaster, United
16 States Senate,

17 (5) for the payment of metered charges on
18 copying equipment provided by the Office of the Ser-
19 geant at Arms and Doorkeeper, United States Sen-
20 ate,

21 (6) for the payment of Senate Recording and
22 Photographic Services, or

23 (7) for the payment of franked and mass mail
24 costs by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and
25 Doorkeeper, United States Senate.

1 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
2 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
3 pensation of employees of the committee from October 1,
4 1999, through September 30, 2000, and October 1, 2000,
5 through February 28, 2001, to be paid from the Appro-
6 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
7 tigations”.
