Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Indian Affairs.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. CAMPBELL, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Indian
Affairs.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, and making investiga-
5 tions as authorized by paragraphs 1 and 8 of rule XXVI
6 of Standing Rules of the Senate, the Committee on Indian
7 Affairs is authorized from October 1, 1999, through Feb-
8 ruary 28, 2001, in its discretion (1) to make expenditures
9 from the contingent fund of the Senate, (2) to employ per-
10 sonnel, and (3) with the prior consent of the Government

1 department or agency concerned and the Committee on
2 Rules and Administration, to use on a reimbursable or
3 nonreimbursable basis the services of personnel of any
4 such department or agency.

5 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
6 period October 1, 1999, through September 30, 2000,
7 under this resolution shall not exceed \$1,260,534, of
8 which amount (1) no funds may be expended for the pro-
9 curement of the services of individual consultants, or orga-
10 nizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the
11 Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and
12 (2) not to exceed \$1,000 may be expended for the training
13 of the professional staff of such committee (under proce-
14 dures specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorga-
15 nization Act of 1946).

16 (b) For the period October 1, 2000, through Feb-
17 ruary 28, 2001, expenses of the committee under this res-
18 olution shall not exceed \$537,123, of which amount (1)
19 no funds may be expended for the procurement of the
20 services of individual consultants, or organizations thereof
21 (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorga-
22 nization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2) not to exceed
23 \$1,000 may be expended for the training of the profes-
24 sional staff of such committee (under procedures specified

1 by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
2 1946).

3 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its finding, to-
4 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
5 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
6 date, but not later than February 29, 2000, and February
7 28, 2001, respectively.

8 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
9 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the fund
10 of the Senate upon vouchers approved by the chairman
11 of the committee, except that vouchers shall not be re-
12 quired (1) for the disbursement of the salaries of employ-
13 ees paid at an annual rate, or (2) for the payment of tele-
14 communications provided by the Office of the Sergeant at
15 Arms and Doorkeeper, United States Senate, or (3) for
16 the payment of stationery supplies purchased through the
17 Keeper of the Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for
18 payments to the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5)
19 for the payment of metered charges on copying equipment
20 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
21 keeper, United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of
22 Senate Recording and Photographic Services, or (7) for
23 payment of franked and mass mail costs by the Sergeant
24 at Arms and Doorkeeper, United States Senate.

1 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
2 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
3 pensation of employees of the committee from October 1,
4 1999, through September 30, 2000, and October 1, 2000,
5 through February 28, 2001, to be paid from the Appro-
6 priations account for “Expenses of Inquires and Investiga-
7 tions.”

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
