"(p) STATE MORATORIA.—When there is in effect 6 7 with respect to lands beneath navigable waters of a coastal 8 State a moratorium on oil, gas, or other mineral exploration, development, or production activities established by 9 10 statute or by order of the Governor, the Secretary shall not issue a lease for the exploration, development, or pro-11 12 duction of minerals on submerged lands of the Outer Continental Shelf that are seaward of or adjacent to those 13 14 lands.".
