- 3 SECTION 1. RADIATION EXPOSURE COMPENSATION TRUST
- 4 FUND.
- 5 (a) APPROPRIATIONS.—There are appropriated, out
- 6 of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
- 7 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2001,
- 8 \$84,000,000 to the Radiation Exposure Compensation
- 9 Trust Fund to remain available until expended for the

- 1 purpose of making payments to eligible beneficiaries under
- 2 the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act (42 U.S.C.
- 3 2210 note).
- 4 (b) Emergency Requirement.—The entire amount
- 5 made available under subsection (a)—
- 6 (1) shall be available only to the extent that the
- 7 President submits to Congress an official budget re-
- 8 quest for up to \$84,000,000 that includes designa-
- 9 tion of the entire amount of the request as an emer-
- gency requirement for the purposes of the Balanced
- Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985
- 12 (2 U.S.C. 900 et seq.); and
- 13 (2) is designated by Congress as an emergency
- requirement under section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
- anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
- 16 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901(b)(2)(A)).
