## A BILL

To provide for the liquidation or reliquidation of certain  
entries of garlic.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. CERTAIN ENTRIES OF GARLIC.**

4       (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 514 of  
5       the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other pro-  
6       vision of law and subject to the provisions of subsection  
7       (b), the United States Customs Service shall—

8               (1) not later than 90 days after the receipt of  
9       the request described in subsection (b), liquidate or  
10       reliquidate as free from duty the entries listed in  
11       subsection (c); and

1           (2) not later than 90 days after such liquida-  
 2           tion or reliquidation, refund any duties paid with re-  
 3           spect to such entries (including interest from the  
 4           date of entry), including duties paid in June 1999  
 5           and duties paid on February 8, 2000 (collection re-  
 6           ceipt number 543514640).

7           (b) REQUESTS.—Liquidation or reliquidation may be  
 8           made under subsection (a) with respect to an entry de-  
 9           scribed in subsection (c) only if a request therefor is filed  
 10          with the Customs Service not later than 90 days after the  
 11          date of the enactment of this Act.
