A BILL

To amend the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 to make the budget process more transparent.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Transparency in Budg-
- 5 eting Act of 2001".

SEC. 2. TRANSPARENCY REQUIREMENT.

- 2 (a) In General.—Title III of the Congressional
- 3 Budget Act of 1974 is amended by adding at the end the
- 4 following new section:
- 5 "TRANSPARENCY REQUIREMENT
- 6 "Sec. 316. It shall not be in order in the House of
- 7 Representatives or the Senate to consider any bill or joint
- 8 resolution, or amendment thereto or conference report
- 9 thereon, reducing revenues in which all changes in law
- 10 made by such measure are not completed by the fifth cal-
- 11 endar year beginning after the date of enactment of such
- 12 measure.".
- 13 (b) Conforming Amendment.—The table of con-
- 14 tents set forth in section 2(a) of the Congressional Budget
- 15 and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is amended by in-
- 16 serting after the item relating to section 315 the following
- 17 new item:

"Sec. 316. Transparency requirement.".
