- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

 SECTION 1. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR PRESUMPTION OF

 SERVICE-CONNECTION RESULTING FROM EXPOSURE TO IONIZING RADIATION DUE TO
 OPEN-AIR NUCLEAR TESTING.

 Section 1112(c) of title 38, United States Code, is
- 3 amended—

1	(1) in paragraph $(3)(B)(i)$, by inserting before
2	the period at the end the following: "or exposure to
3	ionzing radiation due to residual contamination re-
4	sulting from such a detonation"; and
5	(2) by adding at the end the following new
6	paragraph:
7	"(4) For purposes of paragraph (3)(B)(i), onsite par-
8	ticipation by any individual in a test involving the atmos-
9	pheric detonation of a nuclear device and any exposure
10	to ionzing radiation due to residual contamination result-
11	ing from such a detonation shall be determined without
12	regard to whether any particular level of radiation expo-
13	sure was measured for that individual.".
