A BILL

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Budget First Act”.

3 **SEC. 2. SUPER-MAJORITY REQUIRED TO WAIVE SECTION**

4 **303.**

5 Section 904 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974

6 is amended as follows:

7 (1) In subsection (c)(1), insert “303(a),” after
8 “Sections”.

9 (2) In subsection (d)(2), insert “303(a),” after
10 “sections”.

11 **SEC. 3. RULE WAIVING SECTION 303 IN THE HOUSE OF REP-**

12 **RESENTATIVES.**

13 Clause 6(c) of rule XIII of the Rules of the House
14 of Representatives is amended by striking the period at
15 the end of subparagraph (2) and inserting a semicolon and
16 by adding at the end the following new subparagraph:

17 “(3) a rule or order proposing that section
18 303(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 be
19 waived by a vote of less than three-fifths of the
20 Members voting, a quorum being present.”.
