## A BILL

To amend the Torture Victims Relief Act of 1998 to authorize appropriations to provide assistance for domestic centers and programs for the treatment of victims of torture.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Torture Victims Relief
- 5 Reauthorization Act of 2001".

#### 2 SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR DOMES-2 TIC TREATMENT CENTERS FOR VICTIMS OF 3 TORTURE. 4 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—Section 5 5(b)(1) of the Torture Victims Relief Act of 1998 (22) 6 U.S.C. 2152 note) is amended to read as follows: 7 "(b) Funding.— 8 "(1) Authorization of appropriations.—Of 9 the amounts authorized to be appropriated for the 10 Department of Health and Human Services for fis-11 cal years 2002, 2003, and 2004, there are author-12 ized to be appropriated to carry out subsection (a) 13 (relating to assistance for domestic centers and pro-14 grams for the treatment of victims of torture) 15 \$20,000,000 for fiscal year 2002, \$25,000,000 for 16 fiscal year 2003, and \$30,000,000 for fiscal year 17 2004.".

18 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by 19 subsection (a) shall take effect October 1, 2001.
