A BILL

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to study the suitability and feasibility of establishing the Buffalo Bayou National Heritage Area in west Houston, Texas.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Buffalo Bayou Na-

5 tional Heritage Area Study Act".

6 SEC. 2. NATIONAL PARK SERVICE STUDY REGARDING BUF-

7 FALO BAYOU, TEXAS.

8 (a) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds the following:

1	(1) The area beginning at Shepherd Drive in
2	west Houston, Texas, and extending to the Turning
3	Basin, commonly referred to as the "Buffalo
4	Bayou", made a unique contribution to the cultural,
5	political, and industrial development of the United
6	States.
7	(2) The Buffalo Bayou is distinctive as the first
8	spine of modern industrial development in Texas and
9	one of the first along the Gulf of Mexico coast.
10	(3) The Buffalo Bayou played a significant role
11	in the struggle for Texas independence.
12	(4) The Buffalo Bayou developed a prosperous
13	and productive shipping industry that survives
14	today.
15	(5) The Buffalo Bayou led in the development
16	of Texas' petrochemical industry that made Houston
17	the center of the early oil boom in America.
18	(6) The Buffalo Bayou developed a sophisti-
19	cated shipping system, leading to the formation of
20	the modern day Houston Ship Channel.
21	(7) The Buffalo Bayou developed a significant
22	industrial base, and served as the focal point for the
23	new city of Houston.
24	(8) There is a longstanding commitment by the
25	Buffalo Bayou Partnership, Inc., to complete the

Buffalo Bayou Trail along the 12-mile segment of
 the Buffalo Bayou.

3 (9) There is a need for assistance for the pres4 ervation and promotion of the significance of the
5 Buffalo Bayou as a system for transportation, in6 dustry, commerce, and immigration.

7 (10) The Department of the Interior is respon-8 sible for protecting the Nation's cultural and histor-9 ical resources. There are significant examples of 10 such resources within the Buffalo Bayou region to 11 merit the involvement of the Federal Government in 12 the development of programs and projects, in co-13 operation with the Buffalo Bayou Partnership, Inc., 14 the State of Texas, and other local and govern-15 mental entities, to adequately conserve, protect, and 16 interpret this heritage for future generations, while 17 providing opportunities for education and revitaliza-18 tion.

(b) STUDY.—The Secretary shall, in consultation
with the State of Texas, carry out a study regarding the
suitability and feasibility of establishing the Buffalo
Bayou National Heritage Area in Houston, Texas.

23 (c) STUDY PROCESS AND COMPLETION.—Section
24 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5(c)) shall

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apply to the conduct and completion of the study required
 by this section.

3 (d) SUBMISSION OF STUDY RESULTS.—The Sec4 retary shall submit to the Committee on Resources of the
5 House of Representatives and the Committee on Energy
6 and Natural Resources of the Senate a report describing
7 the results the study.

8 (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
9 authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to imple10 ment this section \$200,000 for fiscal year 2002.

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
