## 2 MATTABESETT TRAIL FOR STUDY FOR PO-3 TENTIAL ADDITION TO THE NATIONAL 4 TRAILS SYSTEM.

5 Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16
6 U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol7 lowing new paragraph:

8 "(\_\_\_\_) METACOMET-MONADNOCK-MATTABESETT 9 TRAIL.—The Metacomet-Monadnock-Mattabesett Trail, a 10 system of trails and potential trails extending southward 11 approximately 180 miles through western Massachusetts 12 on the Metacomet-Monadnock Trail, across central Con-13 necticut on the Metacomet Trail and the Mattabesett 14 Trail, and ending at Long Island Sound.".

#### 15 SEC. 3. EXPEDITED REPORT TO CONGRESS.

Notwithstanding the fourth sentence of section 5(b)
of the National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b)),
the Secretary of the Interior shall submit the study required by the amendment made by section 2 to Congress
not later than 2 years after the date of the enactment of
this Act.
