# A BILL

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Making Health Care5 Available for Low-Income Workers Act of 2001".

## 6 SEC. 2. WORKING POOR HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUM 7 SUBSIDY DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and9 Human Services shall provide grants to States for dem-

onstration programs under which payments are made to
 reduce the premiums for health benefits coverage under
 group health plans for individuals—

4 (1) who are eligible for benefits under a State's
5 medicaid program (or, at the option of a State, who
6 would be so eligible but for their eligibility or cov7 erage under a group health plan); and

8 (2) whose income does not exceed 185 percent 9 of the income official poverty line (as defined by the 10 Office of Management and Budget, and revised an-11 nually in accordance with section 673(2) of the Om-12 nibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981) applicable 13 to a family of the size involved.

14 (b) AMOUNT OF GRANT.—The amount of a grant to 15 a State under this section may not exceed 50 percent of the premiums for health benefits coverage under a group 16 health plan for which coverage is provided under the dem-17 18 onstration program for eligible low-income workers de-19 scribed in subsection (a). Of the amount so provided— 20 (1) the amount shall first be used to reduce the 21 employee share (if any) of any premiums; and

(2) the remainder (if any) shall be used to reduce the employer's cost of providing the coverage.
(c) PREFERENCE.—In carrying out this section, the
Secretary shall provide preference for States that have in-

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creased the income eligibility threshold under the medicaid
 program.

3 (d) APPLICATIONS, ETC.—No grant shall be made to
4 a State under this section unless the Secretary has ap5 proved an application by the State that meets such condi6 tions as the Secretary establishes.

7 (e) REPORT.—Not later than 2 years after funding 8 is first made available to States under this section, the 9 Secretary shall submit a report to Congress on the success 10 of such grants under this section and shall include in the 11 report such recommendations as the Secretary deems ap-12 propriate.

(f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
are authorized to be appropriated for grants under this
section \$30,000,000 for the 5-fiscal-year period beginning
with fiscal year 2002. Amounts appropriated under this
subsection shall be available for obligation without fiscal
year limitation through the end of such period.

19 (g) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section:

(1) GROUP HEALTH PLAN.—The term "group
health plan" has the meaning given such term in
section 2791(a)(1) of the Public Health Service Act
(42 U.S.C. 300gg–91(a)(1)).

(2) MEDICAID PROGRAM.—The term "medicaid
 program" means a State plan established under title
 XIX of the Social Security Act.

4 (3) PREMIUM.—The term "premium" includes,
5 with respect to a group health plan, the cost of pro6 viding coverage under the plan, including the cost to
7 employees of such coverage.

8 (4) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
9 the Secretary of Health and Human Services.

10 (5) STATE.—The term "State" has the mean11 ing given such term for purposes of the medicaid
12 program.

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
