Mr. PASTOR introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

## A BILL

To revise the boundary of the Tumacacori National Historical Park in the State of Arizona.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Tumacacori National  
5 Historical Park Boundary Revision Act of 2001”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.**

7 (a) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds the following:

8 (1) Tumacacori Mission in southern Arizona  
9 was declared a National Monument in 1908 in rec-

1       ognition of its great historical significance as “one  
2       of the oldest mission ruins in the southwest”.

3               (2) In establishing Tumacacori National Histor-  
4       ical Park in 1990 to include the Tumacacori Mission  
5       and the ruins of the mission of Los Santos Angeles  
6       de Guevavi and the Kino visita and rancheria of  
7       Calabazas, Congress recognized the importance of  
8       these sites “to protect and interpret, for the edu-  
9       cation and benefit of the public, sites in the State  
10      of Arizona associated with the early Spanish mis-  
11      sionaries and explorers of the 17th and 18th cen-  
12      turies”.

13              (3) Tumacacori National Historical Park plays  
14      a major role in interpreting the Spanish colonial her-  
15      itage of the United States.

16      (b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are—

17              (1) to protect and interpret the resources asso-  
18      ciated with the Tumacacori Mission by revising the  
19      boundary of Tumacacori National Historical Park to  
20      include approximately 310 acres of land adjacent to  
21      the park; and

22              (2) to enhance the visitor experience at  
23      Tumacacori by developing access to these associated  
24      mission resources.

1 **SEC. 3. BOUNDARY REVISION, TUMACACORI NATIONAL HIS-**  
2 **TORICAL PARK, ARIZONA.**

3 Section 1(b) of Public Law 101–344 (16 U.S.C.  
4 410ss(b)) is amended—

5 (1) by inserting after the first sentence the fol-  
6 lowing new sentence: “The park shall also consist of  
7 approximately 310 acres of land adjacent to the  
8 original Tumacacori unit of the park and generally  
9 depicted on the map entitled ‘Tumacacori National  
10 Historical Park Proposed Boundary Expansion’,  
11 numbered 311/80,044, and dated July 2001.”; and

12 (2) in the last sentence—

13 (A) by striking “The map” and inserting  
14 “The maps”; and

15 (B) by striking “the offices” and inserting  
16 “the appropriate offices”.
