To amend title 10, United States Code, to establish a program of employment assistance, including employment-related tuition assistance, for military spouses.

## A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to establish a program of employment assistance, including employment-related tuition assistance, for military spouses.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.
- 4 (a) Short Title.—This Act may be cited as the
- 5 "Military Spouse Employment Assistance Act of 2001".
- 6 (b) Table of Contents.—The table of contents of
- 7 this Act is as follows:
  - Sec. 1. Short title; table of contents.
  - Sec. 2. Military spouse employment financial assistance program.

- Sec. 3. Department of Defense employment and training opportunities.
- Sec. 4. Encouragement of Federal partnerships in support of military spouse employment.
- Sec. 5. Encouragement of private-sector employment of military spouses.
- Sec. 6. Employment of military spouses by defense contractors.
- Sec. 7. Effective date.

#### 1 SEC. 2. MILITARY SPOUSE EMPLOYMENT FINANCIAL AS-

- 2 SISTANCE PROGRAM.
- 3 (a) Authority To Provide Specified Forms of
- 4 Financial Assistance to Military Spouses.—(1)
- 5 Chapter 88 of title 10, United States Code, is amended
- 6 by inserting after section 1784 the following new section:
- 7 "§ 1784a. Spouse employment financial assistance
- 8 program
- 9 "(a) Establishment of Program.—The Secretary
- 10 of Defense may conduct a program to provide financial
- 11 assistance to military spouses to assist them in gaining
- 12 employment. As part of such a program, the Secretary
- 13 may carry out a program of tuition assistance for military
- 14 spouses pursuing a program of employment-related edu-
- 15 cation or training.
- 16 "(b) Military Spouse Defined.—In this section,
- 17 the term 'military spouse' means the spouse of a member
- 18 of the armed forces on active duty.
- 19 "(c) Program Goals.—The Secretary shall pre-
- 20 scribe specific goals for the program under this section.
- 21 Those goals shall include goals for improvements in reten-
- 22 tion for married members of the armed forces on active

- 1 duty attributable to improvements in family income of
- 2 those members and resulting improvements in the quality
- 3 of life of those members and their families.
- 4 "(d) Types of Financial Assistance.—Under the
- 5 program, the Secretary may provide financial assistance
- 6 for military spouses for one or more of the following pur-
- 7 poses, as specified in regulations prescribed under this sec-
- 8 tion:
- 9 "(1) Career-related education, in accordance
- with subsection (e).
- 11 "(2) Certification and license fees for employ-
- ment-related purposes.
- "(3) Apprenticeships and internships.
- 14 "(4) Technical training.
- 15 "(5) Training to improve job skills.
- 16 "(6) Career counseling.
- 17 "(7) Skills assessment.
- 18 "(8) Job-search skills.
- 19 "(9) Job-related transportation.
- 20 "(10) Child care.
- 21 "(11) Any additional employment-related pur-
- 22 pose specified in the regulations prescribed under
- subsection (g).
- 24 "(e) Tuition Assistance.—Financial assistance
- 25 under subsection (d)(1) for career-related education shall

- 1 be provided through a tuition assistance program offering
- 2 benefits similar to those provided under the tuition assist-
- 3 ance program for members of the armed forces under sec-
- 4 tion 2007 of this title that will improve education and em-
- 5 ployment opportunities for military spouses.
- 6 "(f) COORDINATION WITH OTHER PROGRAMS.—The
- 7 Secretary shall ensure that the provisions of this section
- 8 are carried out in coordination with other programs of the
- 9 Department of Defense (including the relocation assist-
- 10 ance program under section 1056 of this title) under
- 11 which employment-related assistance may be provided to
- 12 spouses of members of the armed forces.
- 13 "(g) Regulations.—The Secretary of Defense shall
- 14 prescribe regulations for the purposes of the program
- 15 under this section. In those regulations, the Secretary
- 16 shall specify the following:
- 17 "(1) Eligibility for financial assistance under
- the program, including eligibility for tuition assist-
- ance under subsection (e).
- 20 "(2) The types of assistance that may be pro-
- vided.
- "(3) The maximum amount of such assistance
- 23 that may be provided for each of the types of assist-
- ance specified under subsection (d).

- 1 "(h) Initial Implementation on Pilot Basis.—
- 2 (1) During the first three fiscal years during which the
- 3 program under this section is carried out, the program
- 4 shall be conducted on a pilot basis in a limited number
- 5 of geographic areas, including bases overseas, for the pur-
- 6 pose of evaluating different program options and program
- 7 effectiveness.
- 8 "(2) The Secretary shall conduct an evaluation of the
- 9 program at the mid-term point of the pilot program period
- 10 under paragraph (1) and at the conclusion of the pilot
- 11 program period. Each such evaluation shall assess the suc-
- 12 cess of the program, including the success of the program
- 13 in meeting the goals specified for the program. The Sec-
- 14 retary shall submit a report on each such evaluation to
- 15 the Committee on Armed Services of the Senate and the
- 16 Committee on Armed Services of the House of Represent-
- 17 atives.".
- 18 (2) The table of sections at the beginning of such
- 19 chapter is amended by inserting after the item relating
- 20 to section 1784 the following new item:
  - "1784a. Spouse employment financial assistance program.".
- 21 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
- 22 authorized to be appropriated for the military spouse em-
- 23 ployment assistance program under section 1784a of title
- 24 10, United States Code, as added by subsection (a), a total

- 1 of \$12,000,000 for the first three fiscal years during
- 2 which the program is in operation.
- 3 (c) Initial Locations.—The Secretary shall specify
- 4 the specific locations, including bases overseas, at which
- 5 the military spouse employment assistance program under
- 6 section 1784a of title 10, United States Code, as added
- 7 by subsection (a), is to be conducted for the period under
- 8 subsection (h) of that section during which the program
- 9 is to be conducted on a pilot basis.
- 10 SEC. 3. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE EMPLOYMENT AND
- 11 TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES.
- 12 (a) Review of Department of Defense Poli-
- 13 CIES.—The Secretary of Defense shall review Department
- 14 of Defense policies that affect employment opportunities
- 15 for military spouses in the Department of Defense in order
- 16 to maximize those opportunities. The review shall include
- 17 the consideration of providing, to the extent authorized by
- 18 law, separate spouse preferences for employment by ap-
- 19 propriated and nonappropriated fund operations.
- 20 (b) Space-Available Use of Department of De-
- 21 Fense Facilities for Training Purposes.—Section
- 22 1784 of title 10, United States Code, is amended by add-
- 23 ing at the end the following new subsection:
- 24 "(d) Space-Available Use of Facilities for
- 25 Training Purposes.—The Secretary of Defense shall

- 1 take such steps as appropriate to maximize opportunities
- 2 for spouses of members of the armed forces to be provided
- 3 employment-related training in Department of Defense fa-
- 4 cilities on a space-available basis during normal duty
- 5 hours and during other periods when those facilities are
- 6 not being fully utilized.".
- 7 SEC. 4. ENCOURAGEMENT OF FEDERAL PARTNERSHIPS IN
- 8 SUPPORT OF MILITARY SPOUSE EMPLOY-
- 9 MENT.
- 10 Section 1784 of title 10, United States Code, as
- 11 amended by section 3(b), is further amended by adding
- 12 at the end the following new subsection:
- 13 "(e) Employment by Other Federal Agen-
- 14 CIES.—The Secretary of Defense shall work with the Di-
- 15 rector of the Office of Personnel Management and the
- 16 heads of other Federal departments and agencies to facili-
- 17 tate the appropriate use of existing Federal programs and
- 18 resources in support of military spouse employment.".
- 19 SEC. 5. ENCOURAGEMENT OF PRIVATE-SECTOR EMPLOY-
- 20 MENT OF MILITARY SPOUSES.
- 21 Section 1784 of title 10, United States Code, as
- 22 amended by section 4, is further amended by adding at
- 23 the end the following new subsection:
- 24 "(f) Private-Sector Employment.—The Sec-
- 25 retary of Defense—

- 1 "(1) shall seek to develop partnerships with 2 firms in the private sector to enhance employment 3 opportunities for spouses of members of the armed forces and to provide for improved job portability for 5 such spouses, especially in the case of the spouse of 6 a member of the armed forces accompanying the 7 member to a new geographical area because of a 8 change of permanent duty station of the member; 9 and
- "(2) shall work with the United States Chamber of Commerce and other appropriate private-sector entities to facilitate the formation of such partnerships.".

### 14 SEC. 6. EMPLOYMENT OF MILITARY SPOUSES BY DEFENSE

- 15 CONTRACTORS.
- 16 Section 1784 of title 10, United States Code, as
- 17 amended by section 5, is further amended adding at the
- 18 end the following new subsection:
- 19 "(g) Employment With Defense Contrac-
- 20 Tors.—The Secretary of Defense shall prescribe regula-
- 21 tion to ensure, to the extent practicable, that private-sec-
- 22 tor entities, in hiring for work to be performed on a con-
- 23 tract with the Department of Defense, provide preference
- 24 to qualified spouses of members of the armed forces and
- 25 other employment opportunities for such spouses in the

- 1 same manner as is provided for positions in the Depart-
- 2 ment of Defense under subsection (b).".
- 3 SEC. 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 4 The amendments made by this Act shall take effect
- 5 on October 1, 2001.
