## AN ACT

- To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of the suitability and feasibility of establishing the Muscle Shoals National Heritage Area in Alabama, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Muscle Shoals Na-
- 3 tional Heritage Area Study Act of 2002".
- 4 SEC. 2. STUDY.
- 5 The Secretary of the Interior, in consultation with
- 6 appropriate State historic preservation officers, States his-
- 7 torical societies, and other appropriate organizations, shall
- 8 conduct a study regarding the suitability and feasibility
- 9 of designating the study area described in section 3 as
- 10 the Muscle Shoals National Heritage Area. The study
- 11 shall include analysis, documentation, and determination
- 12 regarding whether the study area—
- 13 (1) has an assemblage of natural, historic, and
- cultural resources that together represent distinctive
- aspects of American heritage worthy of recognition,
- 16 conservation, interpretation, and continuing use, and
- are best managed through partnerships among pub-
- lic and private entities and by combining diverse and
- sometimes noncontiguous resources and active com-
- 20 munities;
- 21 (2) reflects traditions, customs, beliefs, and
- folklife that are a valuable part of the national story;
- 23 (3) provides outstanding opportunities to con-
- serve natural, historic, cultural, or scenic features;
- 25 (4) provides outstanding recreational and edu-
- 26 cational opportunities;

- 1 (5) contains resources important to the identi-2 fied theme or themes of the study area that retain 3 a degree of integrity capable of supporting interpre-4 tation;
  - (6) includes residents, business interests, nonprofit organizations, and local and State governments that are involved in the planning, have developed a conceptual financial plan that outlines the roles of all participants (including the Federal Government), and have demonstrated support for the concept of a national heritage area;
    - (7) has a potential management entity to work in partnership with residents, business interests, nonprofit organizations, and local and State governments to develop a national heritage area consistent with continued local and State economic activity; and
- (8) has a conceptual boundary map that is supported by the public.

### 20 SEC. 3. BOUNDARIES OF THE STUDY AREA.

- The study area referred to in section 2 shall be comprised of the following:
- (1) The part of the Tennessee River's water-shed in northern Alabama.

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1 (2)The cities of Florence, Sheffield, 2 Tuscumbia, and Muscle Shoals City, Alabama. (3)The 3 towns of Anderson, Cherokee, 4 Courtland, Leighton, Lexington, Littleville, Bay, Rogersville, Russellville, Town Creek, and Wa-5 6 terloo, Alabama, and their environs. 7 (4) Colbert, Lauderdale, Franklin, and Law-8 rence Counties, Alabama. 9 (5) Other areas that have heritage aspects that 10 are similar to those aspects that are in the areas de-11 scribed in paragraphs (1) through (4) and which are 12 adjacent to or in the vicinity of those areas. 13 SEC. 4. REPORT. 14 Not later than 3 fiscal years after the date on which 15 funds are first made available for this Act, the Secretary of the Interior shall submit to the Committee on Resources 16 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report on 18 the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the
