A BILL

To amend title 32, United States Code, to establish a National Guard program to assist at-risk youth develop life skills.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. NATIONAL GUARD OPERATION ABOUT FACE TO

4

PROVIDE LIFE-SKILLS FOR AT RISK YOUTH.

5 (a) Chapter 5 of title 32, United States Code, is
6 amended by adding at the end the following new section:
7 "\$510. National Guard operation about face to pro8 vide life-skills for at-risk youth

9 "(a) PROGRAM AUTHORITY AND PURPOSE.—The10 Secretary of Defense, through the Chief, National Guard

Bureau, may use the National Guard to conduct an at-1 2 risk youth life skills program to be known as 'National 3 Guard Operation About Face', which shall be a community 4 based outreach program for at-risk youth, which shall in-5 clude after-school and summer classes to provide academic skills, computer literacy, employability skills, life-coping 6 7 skills, and communication skills supplemented with work 8 experience activities to create vibrant communities that 9 foster economic opportunity and encourage life-long learn-10 ing.

"(b) CONDUCT OF THE PROGRAM.—(1) The Secretary of Defense shall provide for the conduct of the National Guard Operation About Face in such States as the
Secretary considers to be appropriate.

15 "(2) The Secretary shall carry out the National16 Guard Operation About Face using—

17 "(A) funds appropriated directly to the Sec-18 retary of Defense for the program; and

"(B) nondefense funds made available or transferred to the Secretary of Defense by other Federal
agencies to support the program.

"(3) For purposes of a transfer under paragraph
(2)(B), administration of the National Guard Operation
About Face is a good or service for which an agency agree-

ment may be entered into under section 1535 of title 31,
 United States Code.

3 "(c) PROGRAM AGREEMENTS.—(1) To carry out the 4 National Guard Operation About Face in a State, the Sec-5 retary of Defense shall enter into an agreement with the Governor of the State, or in the case of the District of 6 7 Columbia National Guard, with the commanding general 8 of the District of Columbia National, under which the 9 Governor or the commanding general will establish, orga-10 nize, and administer the National Guard Operation About Face in the State. 11

"(2) The agreement may provide for the Secretary
to provide funds to the State for civilian personnel costs
attributable to the use of civilian employees of the National Guard in the conduct of the National Guard Operation About Face.

"(d) PERSONS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN PROGRAM.—Any at risk youth may participate in the National
Guard Operation About Face. The Secretary of Defense
shall prescribe the standards and procedures for selecting
participants from among at risk youth.

22 "(e) AUTHORIZED BENEFITS FOR PARTICIPANTS.—
23 To the extent provided in an agreement entered into in
24 accordance with subsection (c):

1	"(1) Any funds made available or transferred to
2	the Secretary of Defense by other Federal agencies
3	under section $(b)(2)(B)$ of this section may be used
4	to provide a stipend to participants for the work ex-
5	perience portion of the National Guard Operation
6	About Face:
7	"(A) For the original purpose for which
8	the funds were appropriated and in accordance
9	with the regulations of the Federal agency from
10	which the funds were made available or trans-
11	ferred.
12	"(B) For the purpose for which defense
13	funds are appropriated and in accordance with
14	the regulations prescribed by the Secretary of
15	Defense for the National Guard Operation
16	About Face.
17	"(C) In the case of a conflict between the
18	regulations described in paragraph (A) and (B),
19	the regulations of the Federal agency from
20	which the funds were made available or trans-
21	ferred shall apply.
22	((2) A participant in the national Guard Oper-
23	ation About Face may receive the following addi-
24	tional benefits in connection with the program:
25	"(A) Light refreshments.

2 "(C) Supplies.

3 "(D) Services.

4 "(f) PROGRAM PERSONNEL.—Personnel of the Na5 tional Guard of a State in which the National Guard Oper6 ation About Face is conducted may serve on full-time Na7 tional Guard duty for the purpose of providing manage8 rial, administrative, training, or supporting services for
9 the program.

"(g) EQUIPMENT AND FACILITIES.—Equipment and
facilities of the National Guard, including military property of the United States issued to the National Guard,
may be used in carrying out the National Guard Operation
About Face.

15 "(h) SUPPLEMENTAL RESOURCES.—To carry out the National Guard Operation About Face in a State, the 16 17 Governor of the State or, in the case of the District of 18 Columbia, the commanding general of the District of Columbia National Guard, may supplement funds made 19 20available under the program out of other resources (in-21 cluding gifts) available to the Governor or the com-22 manding general. The Governor or the commanding Fed-23 eral may accept, use, and dispose of gifts or donations of 24 money, other property or services for the National Guard 25 **Operation About Face.**

1 "(i) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

2 "(1) The term 'State' includes the Common3 wealth of Puerto Rico, the territories, and the Dis4 trict of Columbia.

5 "(2) The term 'at-risk youth' has the same
6 meaning given that term in section 1432 of the Ele7 mentary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20
8 U.S.C. 6472.".

9 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
10 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding
11 at the end the following new item:
