A BILL

To provide for the designation of certain closed military installations as ports of entry.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF CERTAIN CLOSED MILITARY
- 4 INSTALLATIONS AS PORTS OF ENTRY.
- 5 (a) Designation.—Subject to subsection (c), the
- 6 President shall designate as a port of entry an airport,
- 7 or a seaport, that is a military installation closed under
- 8 any of the laws referred to in subsection (b) if the local

- 1 authority under which the airport or seaport operates re-
- 2 quests such designation.
- 3 (b) Base Closure Laws.—The laws referred to in
- 4 subsection (a) are—
- 5 (1) the Defense Base Closure and Realignment
- 6 Act of 1990 (part A of title XXIX of Public Law
- 7 101–510; 10 U.S.C. 2687 note);
- 8 (2) title II of the Defense Authorization
- 9 Amendments and Base Closure and Realignment
- 10 Act (Public Law 100–526; 10 U.S.C. 2687 note);
- 11 (3) section 2687 of title 10, United States
- 12 Code; and
- 13 (4) any other law enacted after November 30,
- 14 1993, that provides for the closure of military instal-
- 15 lations.
- 16 (c) Presidential Authority Not To Designate
- 17 Ports of Entry.—The President may decline to des-
- 18 ignate an airport or a seaport as a port of entry under
- 19 subsection (a) if the President—
- 20 (1) determines that the costs to the United
- 21 States Government of conducting operations at a
- port of entry outweigh the economic benefits that
- would accrue to the locality in which the port of
- 24 entry would be located; and

- 1 (2) transmits that determination to the Con-
- 2 gress, together with the reasons therefor.

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
