## A BILL

To authorize additional appropriations to combat bioterrorism.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Food Supply Protec-
- 5 tion Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. BIOTERRORISM FUNDING.
- 7 There are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-
- 8 retary of Agriculture the following sums for the following
- 9 purposes:
- 10 (1) In fiscal year 2002, \$101,212,500 for De-
- 11 partment of Agriculture biosecurity initiatives re-

1	quired under Presidential Directive (PDD-67), to be
2	used to secure resources at existing facilities of the
3	Agricultural Research Service and Animal and Plant
4	Health Inspection Service.
5	(2) In each of fiscal years 2002 through 2011
6	\$177,000,000 for research in support of bioter-
7	rorism response initiatives.
8	(3) In each of fiscal years 2002 through 2011
9	\$57,000,000 to continue joint research initiatives be-
10	tween the Agricultural Research Service, univer-
11	sities, and industry on counter-bioterrorism efforts.
12	(4) In each of fiscal years 2002 through 2011,
13	\$25,000,000 to be used to make competitive grants
14	to universities and qualified research institutions for
15	research on counter-bioterrorism.
16	(5) In fiscal year 2002, for the Plum Island
17	Animal Disease Center, Greenport, New York—
18	(A) \$129,000,000 for renovation, update
19	and expansion of the Biosafety Level 3 labora-
20	tory and animal research facilities; and
21	(B) \$105,000,000 for construction and
22	funding of a Biosafety Level 4 facility.
23	(6) In fiscal year 2002, \$381,000,000 for the
24	Agricultural Research Service/Animal and Plant
25	Health Inspection Service facility in Ames, Iowa.

1	(7) In fiscal year 2002, \$78,500,000 for the
2	planning and design of an Agricultural Research
3	Service biocontainment laboratory for poultry re-
4	search in Athens, Georgia.
5	(8) In fiscal year 2002, \$29,800,000 for the
6	planning, updating, and renovation of the Arthro-
7	pod-Borne Animal Disease Laboratory in Laramie
8	Wyoming.
9	(9) In each of fiscal years 2002 through 2011
10	\$12,000,000 to undertake collaborative research
11	with the Oklahoma City Counter-Terrorism Insti-
12	tute, the Department of Justice, and other law en-
13	forcement and emergency preparedness organiza-
14	tions.
15	(10) In fiscal year 2002, \$10,000,000 for—
16	(A) the purchase of rapid detection field
17	test kits to be distributed by the Secretary of
18	Agriculture to State and local agencies engaged
