A BILL

- To establish an advisory board to monitor the collection and allocation of relief funds by charitable organizations in response to a disaster.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Disaster Relief Char-
- 5 ities Accountability Act".

6 SEC. 2. DISASTER RELIEF FUND DEFINED.

7 In this Act the term "disaster relief fund" means a
8 fund established by a charitable organization for relief of
9 a specific disaster with contributions totaling at least
10 \$25,000.

1 SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT.

2 There is established a board to be known as the
3 "Charity Accountability Board" (in this Act referred to
4 as the "Board").

5 SEC. 4. DUTIES.

6	The	Board	shall—

7 (1) request information from and make rec8 ommendations to qualifying charitable organizations
9 regarding—

10 (A) the amount of disaster relief funds col11 lected and dispersed by such organizations;

12 (B) the administrative costs incurred by
13 such organizations in administering disaster re14 lief funds; and

15 (C) the criteria used by such organizations16 in dispersing disaster relief funds;

17 (2) provide information about disaster relief
18 funds to disaster victims and those wishing to con19 tribute to such funds; and

20 (3) report to the President and the Congress on21 the status of such funds.

22 SEC. 5. MEMBERSHIP.

(a) APPOINTMENT AND TERMS.—The Board shall becomposed of 5 members appointed as follows:

25 (1) The Director of the Federal Emergency26 Management Agency, or the Director's delegate.

(2) Two members appointed by the President,
 who shall each serve for a term of 4 years.

3 (3) One member appointed by the Speaker of4 the House, who shall serve for a term of 2 years.

5 (4) One member appointed by the majority
6 leader of the Senate, who shall serve for a term of
7 2 years.

8 (b) VACANCIES.—A vacancy in the Commission shall
9 be filled in the manner in which the original appointment
10 was made.

(c) BASIC PAY AND TRAVEL EXPENSES.—Members
shall serve without pay but shall receive travel expenses,
including per diem in lieu of subsistence, in accordance
with applicable provisions under subchapter I of chapter
57 of title 5, United States Code.

16 (d) MEETINGS.—The Board shall meet at the call of17 a majority of its members.

18 SEC. 6. DIRECTOR AND STAFF.

19 (a) DIRECTOR.—The Board may appoint a Director20 and such additional personnel as it considers appropriate.

(b) APPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN CIVIL SERVICE
LAWS.—Any Director and staff appointed under subsection (a) shall be appointed subject to the provisions of
title 5, United States Code, governing appointments in the
competitive service, and shall be paid in accordance with

the provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter
 53 of that title relating to classification and General
 Schedule pay rates.

4 SEC. 7. REPORTING.

5 The Board shall transmit to the President and the 6 Congress monthly reports concerning the information col-7 lected and disseminated and recommendations made by 8 the Board, and any other information the Board considers 9 appropriate.

10 SEC. 8. TERMINATION.

Section 14(a)(2)(B) of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App. relating to the termination of
advisory committees) shall not apply to the Board.

14 SEC. 9. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

15 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums16 as may be necessary to carry out this Act, to remain avail-17 able until expended.
