6	(a) Attendance Through Graduation.—Not-
7	withstanding subsection (c) of section 2164 of title 10,
8	United States Code, an individual who, as of the date of
9	the enactment of this Act, is a dependent of a Federal
10	employee and is enrolled in an educational program pro-
11	vided by the Secretary of Defense under such section in
12	Puerto Rico is entitled to continue enrollment in such pro-
13	grams until the individual's graduation from secondary
14	school. The Secretary may not require reimbursement for
15	the educational services provided to the individual.
16	(b) Removal for Cause.—Subsection (a) does not
17	limit the authority of the Secretary of Defense to remove
18	a dependent from enrollment in an educational program
19	provided by the Secretary pursuant to section 2164 of title
20	10, United States Code, at any time for good cause deter-
21	mined by the Secretary.
