5 Section 7(j) of the Endangered Species Act of 1973
6 (16 U.S.C. 1536(j)) is amended—

(1) by inserting "(1)" after "(j)"; and

8 (2) by adding at the end the following new9 paragraph:

10 "(2) The head of a Federal agency may authorize, 11 fund, or carry out an agency action notwithstanding any other provision of this Act upon a determination that the 12 13 action is to be undertaken in response to an emergency that involves or will likely involve the health and safety 14 15 of persons and a determination that the nature of the 16 emergency does not reasonably permit the application, 17 consultation, and consideration process otherwise required 18 by subsections (g) and (h). The agency head shall delegate 19 the authority to make such determinations to appropriate 20field officers of the agency so as to ensure the timely response by the agency to such emergencies. The agency 21 22 head shall notify the Committee of an exemption granted 23 by the agency under this paragraph as soon as practicable, 24 and the Committee shall accept such determinations and approve the exemption.". 25
