A BILL

To amend the Revised Statutes of the United States to limit the recovery of attorneys' fees in certain civil rights cases.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Student Freedom of
5 Religious Expression Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON RECOVERY OF ATTORNEYS' FEES IN**
2 **CERTAIN CASES.**

3 Section 722(b) of the Revised Statutes of the United
4 States (42 U.S.C. 1988(b)) is amended—

5 (1) by striking “In” and inserting “Except as
6 otherwise provided in this subsection, in”;

7 (2) by striking “, except that” and inserting “.
8 However,”; and

9 (3) by adding at the end the following: “Attor-
10 neys’ fees under this section may not be allowed in
11 any action claiming that a public school or its agent
12 violates the constitutional prohibition against the es-
13 tablishment of religion by permitting, facilitating, or
14 accommodating a student’s religious expression.”.
