## A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to issue rightof-way permits for natural gas pipelines within the boundary of Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PERMITS FOR EXISTING NATURAL GAS PIPE-
- 4 LINES.
- 5 (a) In General.—The Secretary of the Interior may
- 6 issue right-of-way permits for natural gas pipelines that
- 7 exist as of September 1, 2001, within the boundary of
- 8 Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

1	(b) Terms and Conditions.—A permit issued
2	under subsection (a) shall be—
3	(1) issued consistent with laws and regulations
4	generally applicable to utility rights-of-way within
5	units of the National Park System; and
6	(2) subject to any terms and conditions that the
7	Secretary deems necessary.
8	SEC. 2. PERMITS FOR PROPOSED NATURAL GAS PIPELINES.
9	(a) In General.—The Secretary of the Interior may
10	issue right-of-way permits for natural gas pipelines within
11	the boundary of Great Smoky Mountains National Park
12	that are proposed to be constructed across the following:
13	(1) The Foothills Parkway.
14	(2) The Foothills Parkway Spur between Pi-
15	geon Forge and Gatlinburg.
16	(3) The Gatlinburg Bypass.
17	(b) Terms and Conditions.—A permit issued
18	under subsection (a) shall be—
19	(1) issued consistent with laws and regulations
20	generally applicable to utility rights-of-way within
21	units of the National Park System; and
22	(2) subject to any terms and conditions that the
23	Secretary deems necessary including—

1	(A) provisions for the protection and res-
2	toration of park resources that are disturbed by
3	pipeline construction; and
4	(B) assurances that construction and oper-
5	ation of the pipeline will not adversely affect
6	Great Smoky Mountains National Park.
