A BILL

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Recruiting, Retention,3 and Reservist Promotion Act".

4 SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF HAZARDOUS DUTY PAY AND DIVING 5 PAY IN COMPUTATION OF MILITARY RETIRED 6 PAY FOR MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES 7 WITH EXTENSIVE HAZARDOUS DUTY EXPERI8 ENCE.

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Chapter 71 of title 10, United
10 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol11 lowing new section:

12 "§ 1414. Increase in retired pay for members with extensive hazardous duty experience

14 "(a) INCREASE IN RETIRED PAY FOR QUALIFYING
15 MEMBERS.—The retired pay of a member who performs
16 qualifying hazardous duty and who retires on or after the
17 date of the enactment of this section shall be increased
18 by the amount determined under subsection (b).

19 "(b) COMPUTATION OF INCREASE.—The amount of
20 an increase in retired pay under this section shall be sum
21 of the following:

"(1) HAZARDOUS DUTY SPECIAL PAY.—If the
member received special pay under section 301 of
title 37, the amount equal to the product of—

25 "(A) the monthly amount of special pay
26 under that section as in effect for the final
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1	month for which the member received that spe-
2	cial pay; and
3	"(B) the fraction in which the numerator
4	is the number of months for which the member
5	received such special pay and the denominator
6	is the total number of months for which the
7	member received basic pay.
8	"(2) DIVING DUTY SPECIAL PAY.—If the mem-
9	ber received special pay under section 304 of title
10	37, the amount equal to the product of—
11	"(A) the monthly amount of special pay
12	under that section as in effect for the final
13	months for which the member received that spe-
14	cial pay; and
15	"(B) the fraction in which the numerator
16	is the number of months for which the member
17	received such special pay and the denominator
18	is the total number of months for which the
19	member received basic pay.
20	"(c) Qualifying Members.—A member shall be
21	considered to have performed qualifying hazardous duty
22	for purposes of this section if the member received special
23	pay under section 301 of title 37 (relating to special pay
24	for hazardous duty) or section 304 of title 37 (relating

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to special pay for diving duty), or both, for not less than
 60 months (whether or not consecutive).

"(d) TREATMENT UNDER OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO RETIRED PAY.—An amount by which retired
pay is increased under this section shall not be considered
to be retired pay for purposes of section 1408 of this title
or for purposes of the Survivor Benefit Plan under subchapter II of chapter 73 of this title.

9 "(e) RETAINER PAY.—In this section, the term 're10 tired pay' includes retainer pay payable under section
11 6330 of this title.".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding
at the end the following new item:

"1414. Increase in retired pay for members with extensive hazardous duty experience.".

15 SEC. 3. STUDY OF TAX CREDITS AND SMALL BUSINESS
16 LOAN CHANGES TO ASSIST BUSINESSES THAT
17 EMPLOY GUARD AND RESERVE MEMBERS.
18 (a) STUDY REQUIRED.—The Comptroller General
19 shall conduct a study to determine—

(1) whether members of the National Guard
and Reserve comprise a disproportionately large portion of the employees of any size or type of business,
including small business concerns;

(2) the amount of Federal tax benefit which
 would be appropriate to compensate such a business
 for costs associated with employing members of Na tional Guard and Reserve units and having such
 members called to active duty; and

6 (3) whether changes can be made to the small 7 business loan program, such as a targeted level of 8 loans, reduced interest rates, and reduced paperwork 9 burdens for loan applications, to assist small busi-10 ness concerns to deal with the costs associated with 11 employing members of National Guard and Reserve 12 units and having such members called to active duty. 13 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General shall 14 15 submit to congress a report containing the results of the study. The report shall include legislative proposals— 16

17 (1) to provide the recommended tax benefit18 identified in the study; and

19 (2) to modify the small business loan program
20 to assist small business concerns that employ mem21 bers of National Guard and Reserve units.

22 SEC. 4. REPORT ON EXPANSION OF JUNIOR ROTC AND
23 SIMILAR MILITARY PROGRAMS FOR YOUNG
24 PEOPLE.

25 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

(1) the Junior Reserve Officers' Training
 Corps, the Civil Air Patrol, the Naval Sea Cadet
 Corps, and the Young Marines of the Marine Corps
 League provide significant benefits for the Armed
 Forces, including significant public relations bene fits; and

7 (2) there is substantial interest in expanding8 the scope of these programs.

9 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date 10 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense shall submit to Congress a report providing the Sec-11 12 retary's assessment of the feasibility and desirability of ex-13 panding the Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps program of each of the military departments, the Civil Air 14 15 Patrol, the Naval Sea Cadet Corps, and the Young Marines of the Marine Corps League. The report shall include 16 17 such recommendations as the Secretary considers appropriate for expansion of these programs through an in-18 crease in the number of units or participants in these pro-19 20 grams, increased funding for these programs, or such 21 other means as the Secretary determines.

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
