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To provide adequate school facilities within Yosemite National Park, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Yosemite National3 Park Education Improvement Act".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

5 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

6 (1) The three elementary schools serving the
7 children of employees of Yosemite National Park are
8 served by the Bass Lake Joint Union Elementary
9 School District and the Mariposa Unified School
10 District.

(2) The schools are in remote mountainous
areas and long distances from other educational and
administrative facilities of the two local educational
agencies.

(3) Because of their remote locations and relatively small number of students, schools serving the
children of employees of the Park provide fewer
services in more basic facilities than the educational
services and facilities provided to students that attend other schools served by the two local educational agencies.

(4) Because of the long distances involved and
adverse weather and road conditions that occur during much of the school year, it is impractical for the
children of employees of the Park who live within or

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near the Park to attend other schools served by the
 two local educational agencies.

3 (b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to author4 ize the Secretary of the Interior to provide supplemental
5 funding and other services that are necessary to assist the
6 State of California or local educational agencies in Cali7 fornia in providing educational services for students at8 tending schools located within the Park.

9 SEC. 3. PAYMENTS FOR EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.

10 (a) AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FUNDS.—For fiscal years 2003 through 2007, the Secretary may provide 11 12 funds to the Bass Lake Joint Union Elementary School 13 District and the Mariposa Unified School District for educational services to students who are dependents of per-14 15 sons engaged in the administration, operation, and maintenance of the Park or students who live at or near the 16 17 Park upon real property of the United States.

18 (b) LIMITATION ON USE OF FUNDS.—Payments 19 made by the Secretary under this section may not be used 20for new construction, construction contracts, or major cap-21 ital improvements, and may be used only to pay public 22 employees for services otherwise authorized by this Act. 23 (c) LIMITATION ON AMOUNT OF FUNDS.—Payments 24 made under this section shall not exceed the lesser of 25 \$750,000 in any fiscal year or the amount necessary to

provide students described in subsection (a) with edu cational services that are normally provided and generally
 available to students who attend public schools elsewhere
 in the State of California.

5 (d) ADJUSTMENT OF PAYMENTS.—Subject to subsection (c), the Secretary is authorized to adjust payments 6 7 made under this section if the State of California or the 8 appropriate local educational agencies do not continue to 9 provide funding for educational services at Park schools 10 at per student levels that are equivalent to or greater than those provided in the fiscal year prior to the date of enact-11 ment of this Act. 12

13 (e) Source of Payments.—

14 (1) AUTHORIZED SOURCES.—Except as pro15 vided in paragraph (2), in order to make payments
16 under this section, the Secretary may use funds
17 available to the National Park Service from appro18 priations, donations, or fees.

19 (2) EXCEPTIONS.—Funds from the following
20 sources may not be used to make payments under
21 this section:

(A) Fees authorized and collected under
the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of
1965 (16 U.S.C. 460*l*-4 et seq.).

| 18 | tary and Secondary Education Act of 1965. |
| 19 | (2) Educational services.—The term "edu- |
| 20 | cational services" means services that may include |
| 21 | maintenance and minor upgrades of facilities and |
| 22 | transportation to and from school. |
| 23 | (3) PARK.—The term "Park" means Yosemite |
| 24 | National Park. |

(4) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
 the Secretary of the Interior.
